If in eyes: Flush with plenty of water. Get medical attention if irritation persists.

If on skin: Wash off with soap and water.

If inhaled: Remove victim to fresh air. Do not breath dust.

Only for formulation into a Rodenticide for (1) The following uses: control of Norway rats, roof rats, and house mice in and around homes, industrial buildings, and similar man-made structures; (2) Uses for which USEPA has accepted the required data and/or citations of data that the formulator has submitted in support of registration; and (3) Uses for experimental purposes that are in compliance with USEPA requirements.

Formulators are responsible for providing data to support their registration.



STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Do not contaminate water, food, or feed by storage or disposal.

STORAGE: Store in original container in a dry area not accessible to children, pets, domestic animals or wildlife. If container is damaged: Stop any leaks by repositioning the container or otherwise repairing the leaks. Take care to avoid contact with pesticide and wear protective gear. On cleanup of spills, wear protective equipment as required to prevent contact with the product or its vapors. Sweep onto a shovel and put the sweepings into a salvage drum.
