DIRECTIONS: Before using this compound, exposed food products and packaging materials must be removed from the room or protected. After using this compound, equipment & utensils must be thoroughly rinsed with potable water before operations are resumed. Application confined to time periods when plant is not in operation. Dilute with Deodorized Kerosene on a 1 to 6 basis to be used as a surface spray for control of roaches, waterbugs & silverfish in the edible products areas of Federally Inspected Meat & Poultry Processing Plants.

FOR CONTROL OF ROACHES, WATERBUGS & SILVERFISH, THOROUGH & REPEATED SPRAYING OF THE INFESTED AREA WORKING THE SPRAY INTO CRACKS & OTHER HIDING PLACES IS RECOMMENDED. EMPHASIS SHOULD BE PLACED ON HITTING THE INSECTS DIRECTLY & ON REPEATED APPLICATIONS.

..... these common stored product pests:

CLOSE WINDOWS & DOORS & SHUT OFF VENTILATING SYSTEM. USE A FOGGER OR VAPORIZER ADJUSTED TO DELIVER AN AEROSOL SPRAY (NO DROPLETS OVER 50 MICRONS IN DIAMETER & 80% LESS THAN 30 MICRONS). APPLY AT THE RATE OF 1 OZ. PER 1000 CU.FT. OF SPACE. DIRECT THE SPRAY TOWARD THE CEILING & UP PER CORNERS OF AREA & BEHIND OBSTRUCTIONS. KEEP AREA CLOSED FOR AT LEAST 15 MIN. VACATE TREATED AREA & VENTILATE BEFORE REOCCUPYING. REPEAT TREATMENT AS NECESSARY.

The above described application will kill acces- sible, exposed stages of flies, fruit flies, mos- quitoes, silverfish, flying moths, gnats, crick- ets, roaches, spiders, scorpions, wasps, hornet, clover mites, cheese mites, cheese skippers, & granary weevils, rice weevils, confused flour
