3. The statements of practical treatment on the front panel should be preceded by the heading "STAEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT" as you did on the label for 655-19.

with USEPA requirements.

Formulators using this product are responsible for
providing data to support their registration.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Do not contaminate water, food, or feed by storage
or disposal.

STORAGE: Store in original container in a dry area
not accessible to children, pets, domestic animals
or wildlife. If container is damaged: Stop any leaks
by repositioning the container or otherwise repair-
ing the leaks. Take care to avoid contact with
pesticide and wear protective gear. On cleanup of
