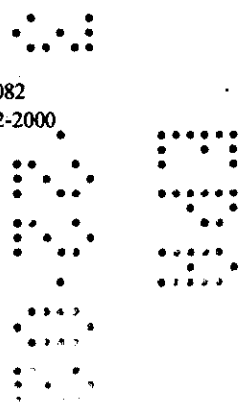

ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS

This product is toxic to mammals and birds. Do not discharge effluent containing this product into lakes, streams, ponds, estuaries, oceans or other waters unless in accordance with the requirements of a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit and the permitting authority has been notified in writing prior to discharge. DIRECTIONS FOR USE

Formulators using this product are responsible for providing data to support their registrations.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Do not contaminate water, food, or feed by storage or disposal.

STORAGE: Store in original container in a dry area not accessible to children, pets, domestic animals or wildlife. If container is damaged: Stop any leaks by repositioning the container or otherwise repairing the leaks. Take care to avoid contact with pesticide and wear protective gear. On cleanup of spills, wear protective equipment as required to prevent contact with the product or its vapors. Sweep onto a shovel and put the sweepings into a salvage drum. Dispose of wastes as specified below.
