**Number Three:** Spray as directed in the rate chart. Use coarse drenching spray for trees, soil and other surface applications. Use medium fine mist sprays for trees and plants. Thorough coverage is important. Flush sprayer with clean water after each use.

The labeling referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), is acceptable, and a stamped copy is enclosed for your records.

Please advise your printer to make the following revisions <sup>before you release</sup> ~~the enclosed finished labeling~~: *The product for shipping*

1. Insert "DIAZINON" before the formula name, which should appear in brackets, in the ingredients statement.
2. The solvent could appear as "Xylene Range Aromatic Solvent."
3. Revise the Statement of Practical Treatment to read:

If swallowed - Call a physician or Poison Control Center immediately. DO NOT INDUCE VOMITING. Vomiting may cause aspiration pneumonia.

If inhaled - Remove victim to fresh air. Apply artificial respiration if indicated.

If on skin - Remove contaminated clothing and wash affected areas with soap and water.

If in eyes - Flush eyes with plenty of water. Call a physician immediately.

Note to Physician - Solvent presents aspiration hazard. Gastric lavage is indicated if material was taken

internally. If symptoms of cholinesterase inhibition are present, atropine sulfate is antidotal. 2-Pam is also antidotal and may be administered in conjunction with atropine.

4. Change "sprayed grass" to "treated areas" in the Hazards to Humans and Domestic Animals section.
5. Delete "Do not apply where runoff is likely to occur" in the "Environmental Hazards."
6. Change "Fruit Flies" to "Frit Flies" in the Lawn Pests table.
7. Delete "Buildings" from the Pless section heading. In this same section delete "Do not use in food handling or food processing areas" since this is not appropriate for Laundry Trucks and Dog Kennels. Also, clarification of directions is needed for these two specific sites, each site should have separate directions. It is assumed that your company is in possession of data to show that the use in laundry trucks will not result in residues on clothing placed in the trucks or present dermal or inhalation problems for the drivers.
8. It is assumed that the service person limitation, added previously by add-on label, will appear on labeling of containers over 1 gallon.
  - a. Revise the Pesticide Disposal text to read as follows:

Pesticide wastes are toxic. Improper disposal of excess pesticide, spray mixture, or rinsate is a violation of Federal Law. If these wastes cannot be disposed of by use according to label instructions, contact your State Pesticide or Environmental Control Agency, or the Hazardous Waste representative at the nearest EPA Regional Office for guidance.

Please submit five (5) copies of the actual finished labels once they become available.
