DIRECTIONS FOR USE (Cont'd.)

Soil Application: To control cutworms and wireworms prior to planting of the following vegetables:

Apply evenly as a broadcast treatment over the surface of the soil. Immediately after spreading, mix thoroughly with the soil to a depth of 6-8 inches. Apply 1/2 lb. per 225 sq. ft.

Foliage Application: Apply dust at first signs of insects. Repeat as necessary. For best results, dust in early morning or late evening when temperature is lower and air is still. Apply dust so that all parts of plants are contacted, especially upper and lower leaf surfaces. Number in parentheses, (), indicates days required between last application and harvest.

*Apply to silks as soon as they appear. Make applications at 3 to 4 day intervals as infestation warrants. Reapply immediately after rain.
