PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS HAZARDS TO HUMANS & DOMESTIC ANIMALS CAUTION

Harmful if swallowed or absorbed through skin. Avoid breathing vapors or spray mist. Avoid contact with skin and eyes. In case of contact, immediately flush eyes or skin with plenty of water. Obtain medical attention if irritation persists. If swallowed, do not induce vomiting. Call a physician immediately.

Do not apply directly to food. Cover or remove any food and food processing equipment during application. Do not apply while food processing is under way. After spraying wash with potable water all equipment, benches, shelving, etc., where exposed food will be handled. All food processing surfaces and utensils should be covered during treatment or thoroughly washed before use.

Remove pets and birds, and cover fish aquariums before spraying.

ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS

This product is toxic to fish, birds, and other wildlife. Do not apply directly to water. Do not contaminate water by disposal of wastes. Apply this product only as specified on this label.

PHYSICAL HAZARDS

Do not use, or store near heat or open flame. Exposure to temperatures above 130° F may cause bursting.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage or disposal. Open dumping is prohibited.

STORAGE: If container is damaged: STOP any leaks by repositioning the container or by patching or otherwise repairing the leaks. Take care to avoid contact with pesticide and wear protective gear. On cleanup of spilled liquids, wear protective equipment as required as to prevent contact with the product or its vapors. Cover the spilled areas with generous amounts of absorbent material, such as clay, diatomaceous earth, sand or sawdust. Sweep the contaminated absorbent on to a shovel and put the sweepings into a salvage drum. Dispose of wastes as below. Place any leaking container into a similar drum or glass container. Do not store, use, pour or spill near heat or open flame.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL: (Cont'd)

PESTICIDE DISPOSAL: Wastes resulting from the use of this product may be disposed of on site or at an approved waste disposal facility.

CONTAINER DISPOSAL: Triple rinse (or equivalent). Then offer for recycling or reconditioning, or puncture and dispose of in a sanitary landfill, or by other procedures approved by State and local authorities.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

HOUSEFLIES AND MOSQUITOES: Close all doors and by windows and thoroughly spray in all parts of the room, particularly toward the ceiling, filling the room with fine mist. Vacate the area immediately after spraying. After 15 minutes, open all doors and ventilate room before reoccupying. Sweep up and destroy the fallen insects.

CLOTHES MOTHS: First clean all articles to be protected followed by a thorough spraying, paying particular attention to the seams and folds. The interior of all containers should also be thoroughly sprayed. Repeat spraying at least once a month unless articles are to be stored immediately after treatment in moth-tight containers, in which case repeated spraying is not necessary.

COCKROACHES (Common American) AND BED BUGS: Spray thoroughly with force into all parts of the room, paying special attention to the cracks and crevices and hitting as many insects as possible. For the control of bed bugs, the bed, tufts and seams in the mattress and all places in the room where bugs may hide should be thoroughly sprayed, repeating the treatment as often as necessary.
