
STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

DIRECTIONS FOR USE (Cont'd)

SPACE SPRAY — To kill flies, mosquitoes, small flying moths and gnats. First cover or remove exposed food and food handling surfaces. Close room and shut off all air conditioning or ventilating equipment. Apply with fogger which gives small particle size, or a mechanical or compressed air sprayer. Direct spray upwards toward the corners of room and ceiling. Apply at the rate of 0.5 to 1.0 fluid ounce per 1000 cubic feet of space to be treated. Leave room closed for ½ hour. Ventilate room thoroughly before re-entering. Repeat as necessary.

CONTACT OR SURFACE SPRAY — To kill roaches, waterbugs, crickets and ants. Use a sprayer that gives large wetting droplets (coarse spray). Force spray into cracks and crevices in walls and floors, areas at base of machinery, behind cabinets, around pipes and openings, along baseboards and other places where insects are known to hide. Use 1 gallon of spray per 1000 square feet of surface to be treated. For ants, spray trails and all points of entry into the building. Spray ant nests directly with a soaking application. It is important in all cases to contact as many insects as possible directly with the spray. Repeat application as necessary to maintain control.

Remove pets and cover fish aquariums before spraying.

Remove patients from hospital rooms before spraying. Ventilate rooms at least two hours before returning patients.


