

Agricultural Use Requirements

Use this product only in accordance with its labeling and with the Worker Protection Standard, 40 CFR part 170. The age, condition of spreader, speed of operation and roughness of lawn will cause variations in rates applied. These suggested spreader settings are for your guidance only.
(Wash granules into soil with 30 gallons of water per 1,000 sq. ft.)

DIRECTIONS ORNAMENTAL TURF
CHINCH BUGS, SOD WEBWORMS, ANTS, EARWIGS, CRICKETS, CUTWORMS, BROWN DOG TICKS AND SOWBUGS (PILLBUGS): Spread uniformly at a rate of 1 pound per 1,000 sq. ft. In Northern states, make first application in May or June, or when insects first appear. Retreat as needed, usually in July or August. Consult your Extension Service Specialist as to exact timing of application.
HYPERODES WEEVIL: Apply uniformly at a rate of 2 lbs. per 1,000 sq. ft. Make the first application of suspected area in mid-April, followed by second application 30 days later.
JAPANESE BEETLE GRUBS & EUROPEAN CHAFER GRUBS: Apply uniformly at a rate of 2 lbs. per 1,000 sq. ft. For Grub control, apply any time between late July and early October.
NOTE: For Hyperodes Weevil and Grubs, make application using the above spreader settings in criss-cross fashion. After application, sprinkle the lawn thoroughly to wash the insecticide off the grass and on to the turf.
THE CONTROL FIRE ANTS UNDER USDA/APHIS PPQ PROGRAM: Apply Prentox Dursban Chlorpyrifos 2.32G for the control of Imported Fire Ants in nursery bench and potting media. Thoroughly mix 1 pound of this product per cubic yard of media. Use equipment suitable to give uniform distribution of granules.

TO TREAT FIELD GROWN WOODY ORNAMENTALS (Balled and Burlapped Stock)
1. To be used as a preharvest treatment on non-food bearing field grown woody ornamentals, use this product in combination with an Imported Fire Ant Bait approved by U.S.D.A. (A.P.H.I.S./P.P.Q.) for use in the U.S.D.A. Fire Ant quarantine program.

2. Apply this product 3 - 5 days after approved bait application, with equipment capable of uniform distribution at a rate of 260 lbs. per acre, or 4.5 lbs. per 750 square feet (6 lbs. A.I. per acre). This application will provide a 60 day certification period following a 30 day exposure period.
3. To extend certification period, re-treat areas with this product every 90 days.
4. Use this product only in accordance with U.S.D.A. guidelines.

Do not use plants for food or feed purposes which have been treated with this product.
COCKROACHES: To help prevent infestation of buildings by cockroaches. Treat band 6 to 10 feet wide around and adjacent to the building where pests are active and may find entrance. Treat at a rate of one pound per 1,000 square feet.
