#### ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS

For Terrestrial Applications: This product is toxic to aquatic organisms, including fish and invertebrates. Drift and runoff may be hazardous to aquatic organisms in water adjacent to treated areas. This product may contaminate water through runoff. This product has a potential for runoff for several weeks after application. Poorly draining soils and soils with shallow water tables are more prone to produce runoff that contains this product.

This product is highly toxic to bees exposed to direct treatment on blooming crops or weeds. Do not apply this product or allow it to drift to blooming crops or weeds while bees are actively visiting the treatment area.

Except as specified in the directions for use, do not apply directly to water, to areas where surface water is present or to intertidal areas below the mean high water mark. Do not contaminate water when disposing of equipment wash-water or rinsate.

For Wide Area Mosquito Adulticide Applications: This pesticide is toxic to aquatic organisms, including fish and invertebrates. Runoff from treated areas or deposition of spray droplets into a body of water may be hazardous to fish and aquatic invertebrates.

When applying as a wide area mosquito adulticide, before making the first application in a season, it is advisable to consult with the state or tribal agency with primary responsibility for pesticide regulation to determine if other regulatory requirements exist.

This product is highly toxic to bees exposed to direct treatment on blooming crops or weeds. Do not apply when bees are visiting the treatment area, except when applications are made to prevent or control a threat to public and/or animal health determined by a state, tribal, or local health or vector control agency on the basis of documented evidence of disease causing agents in vector mosquitoes or the occurrence of mosquito-borne disease in animal or human populations, or if specifically approved by the state or tribe during a natural disaster recovery effort.

# DIRECTIONS FOR USE Restricted Use Pesticide

# It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

# **USE RESTRICTIONS:**

- Remove or cover exposed food and drinking water before application.
- Remove or cover dishes, utensils, food processing equipment and food preparation surfaces or wash them before use.
- When used in food/feed handling facilities: Do not make space spray applications while facility is in operation. Prior to space spray applications, cover or remove food and cover food processing surfaces or clean after treatment and before use.
- If used in edible product areas of federally inspected meat, poultry, shell egg grading, and egg product establishments, this product must be dispersed as an aerosol spray (no droplets over 50 microns in diameter and 80% less than 30 microns).
- Except when applying to animals (pets/livestock), through outdoor residential misting systems or as a mosquito adulticide, do not enter or allow others to enter until sprays have dried or until vapors, mists and aerosols have dispersed and the treated area has been thoroughly ventilated.
- Except when applying to animals (pets/livestock), through outdoor residential misting systems or as a mosquito adulticide, do not apply this product in a way that will contact workers or other persons, either directly or through drift.
- Except when applying to animals (pets/livestock), through outdoor residential misting systems or as a mosquito adulticide, only protected handlers
  may be in the area during application.
- After space spraying, do not remain in treated area. Exit area immediately and remain outside the treated area until aerosols, vapors, and/or mists have dispersed.
- Remove pets and birds, and cover fish aquariums before spraying.
- When used in dairy barns or facilities: Close milk bulk tank lids to prevent contamination from spray and from dead or falling insects. Remove or cover milking utensils before application. Wash teats of animals before milking.
- Do not make applications during rain.
- Do not water the treated area to the point of run-off.
- For pet use: Do not apply to doges less than 12 weeks old. Consult a veterinarian before using this product on medicated, debilitated, aged, pregnant or nursing animals. Sensitivities may occur after using ANY pesticide product for pets. If signs of sensitivity occur, bathe your pet with mild soap and rinse with large amounts of water. If signs continue, consult a veterinarian immediately.
- For use on animals: Do not apply more than 1 time per day.
- Do not wet plants to the point of run-off or drip.
- Not for use on ornamental plants, fruits or vegetables being grown for sale or other commercial use or for commercial seed product or for research purposes. For us on plants intended for aesthetic purposes or climatic modification and being grown in interior plantscapes, ornamental gardens or park3 or on golf courses or lawns and grounds.
- Do not use in aircraft cabins.
- Do not apply directly into sewers or drains, or to any area like a gutter where drainage to storm sewers, water bodies, or aquatic habitat can occur. Do not allow the product to enter any drain during or after application.

To prepare dilutions the concentrate should first be stirred or agitated well. Add the required amount of concentrate to water and blend thoroughly. This will produce a stable micro-emulsion.

#### INDOOR APPLICATION

To kill exposed stages of <u>houseflies</u>, <u>fruit flies</u>, <u>mosquitoes</u>, <u>gnats</u>, and <u>small flying moths</u>, dilute 1 part concentrate in 59 parts water (2.1 ounces per gallon). Close doors and windows and shut off ventilating systems. Apply as a fog or fine mist, directing the spray toward the upper portions of the room and toward windows and other light sources which attract these insects. Thoroughly fill the area with mist using 1 to 2 ounces per 1000 cubic feet. Keep area closed for 10 minutes or more. For initial clean out of infestations of <u>cockroaches</u>, <u>ants</u>, <u>spiders</u>, <u>silverfish</u>, <u>crickets</u>, <u>boxelder bugs</u>, <u>scorpions</u>, and <u>clover mites</u>: Dilute 1 part concentrate in 14 parts water (8.5 fluid ounces per gallon). Apply as a coarse droplet surface spray using approximately 1 gallon to 750 square feet. Spray thoroughly all surfaces where these insects are usually found including walls, baseboards, moldings, doors, cabinets, shelves, sinks and pipes, with special attention to cracks and crevices, niches, dark corners, drains and similar hiding places. Treat ant trails, nests and runs. When possible, spray insects directly. Repeat treatment using a maximum dilution rate of 1 part concentrate in 29 parts water (4.3 fluid ounces per gallon) at a rate of 1 gallon per 750 sq. ft. after an interval of one month or when re-infestation occurs.

IN MILLS, ELEVATORS AND GRANARIES: For rapid initial kill of exposed or accessible stages of granary weevil, rice weevil, confused flour beetles, rust red flour beetle, cadelle, sawtoothed grain beetle, cheese mites and grain mites. Dilute at a rate of 1 part concentrate to 29 parts water (4.3 fluid ounces per gallon). Clean out any waste grain, dust, dirt or debris and destroy before spraying. Apply as a coarse droplet spray using approximately 1 gallon to 750 square feet of surface.

Infested stored products should be fumigated or treated by other effective methods using an approved product intended for this use.

In mills, elevators, and granaries, thoroughly spray floors, walls and other surfaces of bins, storage and handling areas with particular attention to cracks, crevices, and similar protected locations. Treat unloading, handling and processing areas, and apply the insecticide to conveying, processing and handling equipment such as the inside of reel conveyors, purifier conveyors, sifters, roll housings and hoppers, pick up conveyors, etc. Spray thoroughly around the base of heavy machinery and equipment.

Thoroughly treat walls, floors, shelves and other exposed surfaces, and lightly spray each layer of cartons or containers as stacked. Sack surfaces of bagged grain can be sprayed lightly until slightly moist. For protection in transit, treat truck beds, boxcars, and ships' holds before loading.

Using a dilution of 1 part concentrate in 29 parts water (4.3 fluid ounces per gallon), apply at a rate of 1 gallon to 750 square feet of surface with particular attention to cracks, crevices, and similar hiding places.

To kill exposed accessible stages of Indian meal moth and <u>Angoumois grain moth</u> in stored grain: Dilute 1 part of concentrate in 14 parts of water (8.6 fluid ounces per gallon) and apply to the surface of the binned grain at a rate of 2 gallons per 1000 square feet (1.6 pints per 100 square feet). Apply at monthly intervals beginning with the first appearance of moths and continuing until early fall. In case of severe infestation, break up webbing with rake before spraying and make a second application in two weeks.

### IN FOOD PROCESSING PLANTS:

Dilute at a rate of 1 part concentrate to 29 parts water (4.3 fluid ounces per gallon).

For use in horse barns, dairy and hog barns, kennels and other farm structures or buildings housing animals or poultry.

Do not treat dairy or meat producing animals or their housing areas with other fly control measures containing pyrethrins and/or piperonyl butoxide in conjunction with the use of this product to avoid exceeding established tolerances for these actives.

# FOR USE WITH HAND HELD MECHANICAL FOGGERS

To Kill Houseflies, Horn Flies, Stable Flies, Horse Flies, Mosquitoes and Gnats: Dilute with water as below to give 0.10% concentration and apply as a fine mist or fog. Direct spray toward ceiling and upper corners of the room until the area is filled with mist, using about two (2) ounces per 1,000 cubic feet of space.

# FOR USE THROUGH AUTOMATIC SPRAYING SYSTEMS

Not for use in residential areas. Do not use in nurseries or rooms where infants, ill, or aged persons are confined. Do not place metering device directly over or within 8 feet of exposed food, dishes, utensils, food processing equipment and food handling or preparation. Do not install within 3 feet of air vents. Carefully follow directions for the dispenser unit when installing the dispenser and recharging with pesticide or conducting maintenance. Do not apply more than 1 time per day. Do not apply more than 0.0033 lbs pyrethrins per application. This is equivalent to 10 oz of 0.5% pyrethrins per 1000 cu. ft.

To Kill Houseflies, Horn Flies, Stable Flies, Horse Flies, Mosquitoes and Gnats: Add concentrate to tank and add water to obtain desired dilution. Agitate well while adding water. Dispense diluted concentrate through automatic spraying system. Set nozzles to deliver one (1) ounce liquid per minute. Locate nozzles to cover a maximum of 2,000 cubic feet of space per nozzle. Set timer to operate in accordance with equipment directions. Dilute Pyronyl 303 Emulsifiable Concentrate just prior to use as follows:

0.05% Pyrethrins - Add 1 part Concentrate to 59 parts water 0.10% Pyrethrins - Add 1 part Concentrate to 29 parts water

0.50% Pyrethrins - Add 1 part Concentrate to 5 parts water

#### In Animal Premise Automatic Misting Systems:

Do not apply when food, feed and/or water is present.

When using this product, installers and service technicians must comply with the license, certification or registration requirements of the state(s), tribe(s) or local authority(ies) where they are installed.

When applying via a remote activation device, do not apply when people and pets are present. If possible, when applying via automatic time, set the timing for application when people and pets are unlikely to be present.

Direct nozzles to spray towards the target area and away from areas where people are typically present.

Do not use in an evaporative cooling system.

Do not use in misters located within 3 feet of air vents, air conditioner units or windows. If used in a system with a reservoir tank for the end use dilution, the system reservoir tank must be locked. Securely attach the end use pesticide label and a dilution statement to the system reservoir tank in a weather protected area or plastic sleeve. The dilution statement must be phrased as follows: this container holds \_\_\_\_\_parts Prentox Pyronyl 303 Emulsifiable Concentrate to \_\_\_\_\_ parts water.

If used in a direct injection system, the pesticide container must be locked. Securely attach the end use label to the pesticide container in a weather protected area or plastic sleeve.

This product must only be used in systems that have been calibrated to apply no more than the maximum application rate of 0.000476 lbs pyrethrins and 0.008 lbs piperonyl butoxide per 1000 cubic feet per day. This is equivalent to:

0.05% pyrethrins – 14.6 ounces of diluted product per 1000 cubic feet per day 0.10% pyrethrins – 7.3 ounces of diluted product per 1000 cubic feet per day 0.50% pyrethrins – 1.46 ounces of diluted product per 1000 cubic feet per day

#### **ON HORSES**

To kill <u>horn flies</u>, house flies, mosquitoes and <u>gnats</u>, dilute at the rate of 1 part concentrate to 119 parts water (1 fluid ounce per gallon) and apply to wet the hair thoroughly with particular attention to the topline, underline, flanks, withers, and other infested areas. Repeat treatment at intervals of 5 to 12 days for small insect populations or daily when flies are emerging in large numbers.

To kill stable flies, horse flies, and deer flies, dilute 1 part concentrate to 29 parts water (4.3 fluid ounces per gallon) and apply a quart per adult animal to wet the hair thoroughly with particular attention to the legs, flanks, barrel, topline, and other body areas commonly attacked by these flies. Repeat treatment weekly as reeded.

To kill <u>spinose ear ticks</u>, dilute at the rate of 1 part concentrate to 74 parts water (1.7 fluid ounces per gallon) and apply by individual treatment, spraying or pouring 1 to 2 ounces into each ear of large animals.

#### PETS

## READ ENTIRE LABEL BEFORE EACH USE

#### USE ONLY ON DOGS (OVER 12 WEEKS OF AGE) TO KILL FLEAS, LICE, TICKS AND SPINOSE EAR TICKS

ON **DOGS**: To kill fleas, ticks and lice on dogs, and to obtain protection against re-infestation, dilute at 1 to 29 in water and wet the animal by dipping or spraying. For best results against fleas and ticks on dogs, the kennels or animal quarters and bedding should also be treated. To kill <u>spinose ear ticks</u>, dilute at the rate of 1 part concentrate to 74 parts water (1.7 fluid ounces per gallon) and apply by individual treatment, spraying or pouring a few drops into the ears of dogs. Do not reapply product for 7 days.

# MOSQUITO CONTROL OUTDOORS

For use by "ederal, state, tribal, or local government officials responsible for public health or vector control, or by person certified in the appropriate category or otherwise authorized by the state or tribal lead pesticide regulatory agency to perform adult mosquito control applications, or by persons under their direct supervision.

The maximum application rate for wide area mosquito adulticide applications is 0.0025 lbs pyrethrins/acre, or 0.025 lbs piperonyl butoxide/acre, whichever is lower. When targeting *Aedes Taeirorhynchus* and other difficult species, applications may be made up to 0.008 lbs pyrethrins/acre/day, or 0.08 lbs piperonyl butoxide/acre/day, whichever is lower.

Do not apply more than 0.2 lbs pyrethrins/acre/year, or 2.0 lbs piperonyl butoxide/acre/year, whichever is lower, in any treated area. More frequent treatments may be made to prevent or control a threat to public and/or animal health determined by a state, tribal, or local health or vector control agency on the basis of documented evidence of disease causing agents in vector mosquitoes or the occurrence of mosquito-borne disease in animal or human populations, or if specifically approved by the state or tribe during a natural disaster recovery effort.

WIND SPEED: Apply only when wind speed is greater than or equal to 1 mph.

#### Ground Application:

Spray equipment must be adjusted so that the volume median diameter is less than 30 microns (Dv  $0.5 < 30 \mu$ m) and that 90% of the spray is contained in droplets smaller than 50 microns (Dv  $0.9 < 50 \mu$ m). Directions from the equipment manufacturer or vendor, pesticide registrant or a test facility using a laser-based measurement instrument must be used to adjust equipment to produce acceptable droplet size spectra. Application equipment must be tested at least annually to confirm that pressure at the nozzle and nozzle flow rate(s) are properly calibrated.

To control <u>adult mosquitoes</u>, using ground application, dilute 1 part concentrate to 4 parts water (25.6 fluid ounces per gallon). Apply as a fine mist or fog. Treat shrubbery and vegetation where mosquitoes may rest. Shrubbery and vegetation around stagnant pools, marshy areas, ponds and shorelines may be treated. Application of this product to any body of water is prohibited, when used for adult mosquito control. Repeat once or twice a week. With mobile or truck mounted equipment the above application rate will result if a 300 foot swath is treated, traveling at 5 mph, dispensing spray at a rate of 20 fluid ounces per minute

#### **Aerial Application:**

RELEASE HEIGHT FOR AERIAL: Fixed wing- Apply using a nozzle height of no less than 100 feet above the ground or canopy. Rotary wing- Apply using a nozzle height of no less than 75 feet above the ground or canopy.

Spray equipment must be adjusted so that the volume median diameter produced is less than 60 microns (Dv  $0.5 \text{ M} 60 \text{ }\mu\text{m}$ ) and that 90% of the spray is contained in droplets smaller than 80 microns (Dv  $0.9 < 80 \text{ }\mu\text{m}$ ). The effects of flight speed, and for non-rotary nozzles, nozzle angle on the droplet size spectrum must be considered. Directions from the equipment manufacturer or vendor, pesticide registrant or a test facility using a wind tunnel and laser-based measurement instrument must be used to adjust equipment to produce acceptable droplet size spectra. Application equipment must be tested at least annually to confirm that pressure at the nozzle and nozzle flow rate(s) are properly calibrated.

Application using fixed wing aircraft: Use 2-4 ounces of concentrate in 4 gallons of water per acre.

To control mosquito larvae, dilute 13 ½ fluid ounces of concentrate in 5 gallons of water and apply at a rate of 5 gallons per acre. Apply as a coarse wetting spray uniformly over wet lands, swamps, marshes, or shallow water. Do not exceed this dosage or fish kill may result.

# FOR USE THROUGH AUTOMATIC SPRAY SYSTEMS OUTDOORS

To kill Mosquitoes, Flies, Gnats, and other outdoor pests. Fill tank halfway with water, then add concentrate. Fill the rest of the tank with water. Dispense diluted concentrate through automatic spraying system. Locate nozzles a minimum of 10 feet apart or a maximum of 15 feet apart. One nozzle covers 100 square feet. Nozzles should be rated for a maximum of 1.25 oz. per minute. Set timer to operate in accordance with equipment directions.

Dilute Pyronyl 303 Emulsifiable Concentrate just prior to use as follows: 0.05% Pyrethrins - Add 1 part concentrate to 59 parts water.

# FOR OUTDOOR USE IN RESIDENTIAL MISTING SYSTEMS:

When using this product installers and service technicians must comply with the license, certification or registration requirements of the state(s), tribe(s) or local authority(ies) where they are installed.

If the system works on an automatic timer, set the timing for application when people, pets and food are unlikely to be present.

# **DROPSOPHILA OR FRUIT FLY CONTROL:**

Dilute at the rate of 2 parts concentrate with 1200 parts water (22 pints per 150 gallons of water). Thoroughly mix the emulsion in the spray tank. Make treatments as follows:

- 1. To protect tomatoes and fruits in baskets on trucks or in plants, use a product registered for this use such as Pyronyl Crop Spray.
- 2. Spray the raw stock stacked in the yard.
- 3. Dip baskets in the diluted spray after dumping the fruit to kill adhering larvae and pupae.
- 4. After washing and cleaning up the inside of the processing plant and just prior to bringing fruit into it, the entire space inside the cannery should be sprayed at a dilution of 2 parts concentrate to 59 parts water (2 pints) with 7 gallons 3 pints water or 4 tablespoonfuls with 3<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> pints water. At the rate of 1 gallon to 750 square feet (1 quart to 750 square feet) direct spray on walls, ceilings, and floors, paying special attention to forcing spray into all cracks and crevices.

Repeat this procedure two more times. Offer for recycling, if available or recondition equipment or a mix tank or store rinsate for later use or disposal. Repeat this procedure two more times. Offer for recycling, if available the rinsate into application equipment or a mix tank or store rinsate for later use or disposal. Repeat this procedure two more times. Offer for recycling, if available or reconditioning, if appropriate or puncture and dispose of in a sanitary landfill, or by other procedures approved by state and local authorities.
