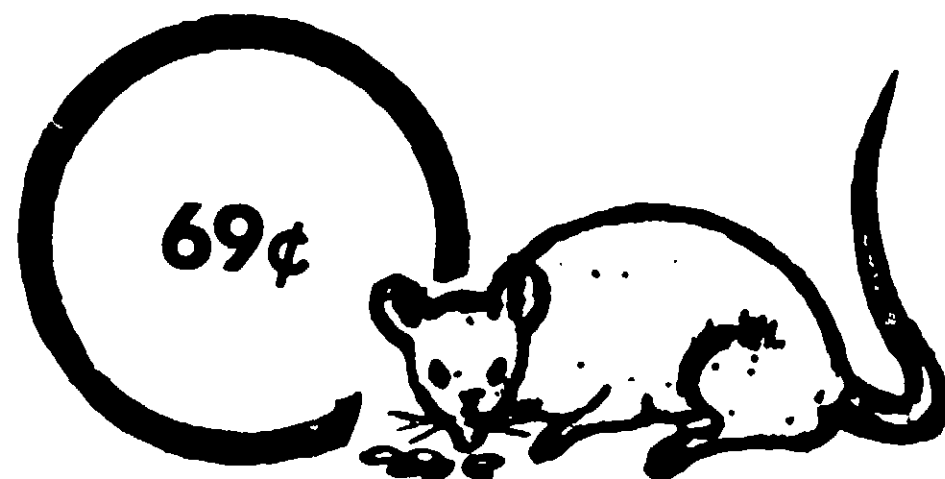

"Treated seeds exposed on soil surface may be hazardous to birds and other wildlife. Do not contaminate water by cleaning of equipment, or disposal wastes. Dispose of excess treated seeds or wastes by burial. Apply this product only as specified on this label."

**DIRECTIONS:** Place small quantities of bait at 8 to 10 feet intervals where mice feed, water and travel. Place baits in boxes constructed of wood or metal, tamper proof and baffled entrances. Remove all other food sources. Collect and burn or bury all uneaten baits after 72 hours. Collect and burn or bury dead animals. Do not treat the same area with strychnine sulfate in less than 60 day intervals. "Do not reuse container. Destroy when empty."

**CAUTION:** "Baits should be placed in areas not accessible to children, pets, wildlife and domestic animals or in tamper proof bait boxes."

**CAUTION:** Poisonous if swallowed. Blam Mouse Killer contains strychnine sulfate a deadly poison. Read all directions and cautions before using.

**ANTIDOTE:** If less than 10 minutes has passed since the poison was taken, give a tablespoon of salt in a glass of warm water. Have victim lie down in a quiet darkened room and keep him warm. Call a physician Immediately!
