**DIRECTIONS:**

Read Entire Label. Follow Directions Carefully. Observe All Cautions.

**MOLES: Lawn Protection (Surface Ridges)** — Runways in which moles are active may be found by rolling or collapsing the ridges at scattered points about the lawn. On the following day the active ridged-tunnels will be reconstructed. Carefully punch a hole in the top of active tunnels, drop in about 1 teaspoonful of Pearson's Poison Peanuts pellets and carefully close the hole. Take care not to again collapse the tunnel or allow loose dirt to cover the Poison Peanuts pellets. Repeat this application about every four feet along the active tunnels. (Use Pearson's Chlordane on lawns, following directions for control of White Grubs and other soil insects which serve as a food supply for Moles).

**Lawn Protection (Deep Tunnels)** — Remove center plug from conical mounds with the aid of a long-handled spoon, and drop in 1 teaspoonful of Pearson's Poison Peanuts pellets into the underground tunnel. Close the opening with rock or sod.

**Bulb Protection (from Moles and Field Mice-Pine Mouse Meadow Mouse and White Footed Mouse)** — Pack about one-half inch of soil around each bulb, and place 1 teaspoonful of Pearson's Poison Peanuts pellets against the soil at the sides of the bulb, not underneath. Moles and Field Mice will eat the Poison Peanuts pellets and be destroyed, leaving the bulbs.

**FIELD MICE: (Pine Mouse, Meadow Mouse and White Footed Mouse)** — **Spot or Trail Baiting** — Place 1 teaspoonful of Pearson's Poison Peanuts pellets in surface trails or at mouth of holes leading to underground burrowing systems. Two to four bait spots should be made near the base of each infested tree. Cover bait by pulling overhanging grass back into place. Do not disturb the runway system. Baiting should be conducted at the rate of 2 to 3 pounds per acre.

**SPECIAL CAUTIONS:** Do not allow bait to be exposed on bare ground. Store this poison in locations not accessible to children or domestic animals. Persons if swallowed. Treated Poison Peanuts pellets exposed on soil surface will be hazardous to poultry, birds and other wildlife.

**POCKET GOPHERS:** Burrowing pocket gophers throw out low, fan shaped mounds on either side of their underground tunnel. These lateral tunnels coming to the surface are on the flat side of the fan and are plugged with soil. With a long-handled spoon carefully remove the plug. Insert 1 teaspoonful of Pearson's Poison Peanuts pellets as far down as possible. Reclose opening.

**GROUNDHOGS:** Place 1 teaspoonful of Pearson's Poison Peanuts pellets around mouth of holes leading to underground burrowing system. Consult your State Fish and Game Agency before applying this product.

**Antidote:** If less than 24 hours has passed since the poison was taken give a tablespoonful of salt in a glass of warm water. Have victim lie down and rest. Seek medical attention. For further information consult your State Health Department.
