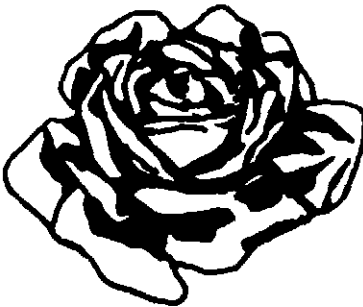

Sulphur (98% through 325 mesh)	20.0%
Copper, as metallic (derived from basic copper sulfate).	3.7%
*Zineb (zinc ethylene bisdithiocarbamate).	3.5%
Carbaryl (1-Naphthyl N-Methylcarbamate)	5.0%
Lindane (gamma isomer of benzene hexachloride)	1.0%

INERT INGREDIENTS	66.8%

*(metallic zinc equivalent 82%)

STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT

- IF SWALLOWED: Call a physician or Poison Control Center immediately. Drink one or two glasses of water and induce vomiting by touching the back of throat with finger. Repeat until vomit fluid is clear. Do not induce vomiting or give anything by mouth to an unconscious person.
- IF INHALED: Remove victim to fresh air. Apply artificial respiration if indicated.
- IF ON SKIN: Remove contaminated clothing and wash affected areas with soap and water.
- IF IN EYES: Flush eyes with plenty of water. Get medical attention if irritation persists.

PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS

Hazards to Humans and Domestic Animals.

CAUTION: Harmful if swallowed. Causes moderate eye irritation. Avoid contact with eyes, skin or clothing. Avoid breathing spray mist or dust. May be absorbed through skin. Wash thoroughly after handling and before eating, drinking or smoking. Avoid contamination of feed and foodstuffs. Do not use or store near heat or open flame. Do not apply this product in such a manner as to directly or through drift expose other persons. The area being treated must be vacated by unprotected persons.

Applicators must wear the following protective clothing during the application process: long-sleeved shirt, long-legged pants, waterproof gloves, full foot covering, and a head covering such as a hat.

ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS

This product is toxic to fish, birds, and other wildlife. Birds and other wildlife feeding in treated areas may be killed. Do not apply directly to water. Do not apply when weather conditions favor drift from areas treated. Do not contaminate water by cleaning of equipment or disposal of wastes.

This pesticide is highly toxic to bees exposed to direct treatment or to residues remaining on the treated area. Do not apply when bees are actively visiting the crop, cover crop, or weeds blooming in the treatment area. Applications should be timed to provide the maximum possible interval between treatment and the next period of bee activity.

PHYSICAL OR CHEMICAL HAZARDS:

Do not use, pour, spill or store near heat or open flame.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE:

It is a violation of Federal Law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

FOR USE AS A DUST: For best results, use in early morning or late evening when the temperature is low and the air is still. Apply dust so all exposed parts of plants are contacted, especially upper and lower leaf surfaces. Repeat dusting at 5 to 10 day intervals or as necessary. Punch holes in lid of can and sift directly on plants; OR BETTER, apply with dust gun. Dust lightly but thoroughly covering foliage.

FOR USE AS A SPRAY: Use 1 pound of ROSE DUST to 12 gallons of water. To make 1 gallon of spray use 5 level tablespoonsful of dust. Mix well, then spray. Shake sprayer occasionally to keep powder in suspension. Be sure to wet under side of leaves.

DISEASES: Roses: Black Spot, Powdery Mildew, Rust. Snapdragon Rust, Carnation Leaf Spots.

INSECT PESTS: Aphids, Canker Worm, Cucumber Beetle, Flea Beetle, Flea Hopper, Japanese Beetle, Rose Chafer, Thrips (certain species), Red Spider.

The amendment referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act, as amended, is acceptable provided that you make the labeling changes listed below before you release the product for shipment bearing the amended labeling:

1. A Symptoms of Poisoning section must be added to the label in close proximity to the STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT; we suggest the following:

"SYMPTOMS OF POISONING: headache, nausea, dizziness, loss of equilibrium, muscle spasms, difficulty in breathing, hyper-excitability and convulsions."

In answer to your question concerning Child Resistant Packaging (CRP), CRP is not required for this product.

Submit five (5) copies of your revised final printed labeling before you release the product for shipment with the amended labeling.

A stamped copy of the label is enclosed for your records.

If you hold a Federal registration, a supplemental registration, or a Special Local Needs registration, you may continue to produce new stocks of such products, using current labeling, until April 1, 1984. After that date, all remaining inventories of affected products will fall under the Existing Stocks provisions stated in our letter of October 28, 1983.
