For control of ~~Cadelle, Angoumois Grain Moth (Exposed Stages), Confused Flour Beetle, Red Flour Beetle, Flat Grain Beetle, Saw-toothed Grain Beetle, Indian Meal Moth (Exposed Stages), Cockroaches, Ants, Silverfish, and Cheese Mites.~~

Spray all areas where insects hide, crawl, or rest, with 1 part Pyrenone E.C. to 9 parts water. Apply at the rate of 1 gallon of mixture per 750 square feet of surface. For control of roaches, and silverfish, thorough and repeated spraying of the infested areas will be needed. Direct spraying of exposed insect should be done when possible. For control of ants follow the above directions for roaches and silverfish, plus treatment of ant trails and areas around door sills and window frames where the ants enter the premises will be needed. Repeated applications will be required in all cases.

DO NOT apply in the edible products area of food processing plants.

For fogging purposes, to kill exposed adults of Granary Weevil, Rice Weevil, Cadelle and Angoumois Moth, dilute with ~~kerosene~~ or water depending on instructions and calibration of the fogger. Apply at one pint of Pyrenone E. C. per 40,000 cubic feet, of space. Repeat as necessary.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE—LIVESTOCK

Horseflies — Stableflies — Deerflies
Dilute 1 to 9 with water. Spray to wet hair over entire animal. Thoroughly cover legs and underline. On dairy animals make application 15 minutes before milking time. Spray applications on all livestock should be made 2 to 3 times a week or as needed.

As an alternative control method against attacks by horseflies, stableflies, and deerflies, on dairy cows and cattle, apply just enough undiluted Pyrenone spray to wet the hair but not enough to soak the hide; using one or two ounces per animal the size of an adult cow. Apply once daily, repeating at daily intervals or as necessary to give continued protection.

TO CONTROL HORNFLIES AND MOSQUITOES:

Dilute 1 to 19 with water and apply as above.

LICE ON HORSES, CATTLE, HOGS AND SHEEP:

Dilute 1 to 100 with water. Apply as a spray or dip to wet all parts of the animal. About 1 1/2 to 3 gallons is required for cattle and proportionally less for hogs and sheep. Repeat as needed.

FLEAS ON DOGS, HORSES, CATTLE, HOGS AND SHEEP:

Dilute 1 to 100 with water. Thoroughly wet coat of animal. Spray animal quarters, bedding and other areas where fleas occur. Repeat treatment as needed.

CHICKEN MITES AND BEDBUGS IN POULTRY HOUSES:

Dilute 1 to 9 with water. Thoroughly spray roosts, nests, litter, and cracks in floors and walls. Repeat treatment as needed.
