During periods of high temperatures, sulphur may burn foliage and fruit. Do not make sulphur applications at excessively high temperatures. Do not use sulphur within 4 weeks of an oil application. If the crop to be treated will be used for commercial canning or freezing purposes, consult food processor before applying sulphur.

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Citrus: To control Rust Mite, use 1/2 to 1 1/2 lbs. per tree, depending on tree size. Apply dust when air is calm and leaves are covered with dew, preferably at night. Do not apply during periods of high temperatures.

Peaches, Plums: To control Brown Rot, Powdery Mildew and Scab, apply 25 to 45 lbs. per acre. Follow locally issued spray schedule for number and frequency of applications. Usually 6 applications are made: No. 1 - when 2/3 petals have fallen; No. 2 - when 3/4 shucks have shed; No. 3 - two weeks later;

No. 4 - Two weeks after No. 3; No. 5 - four weeks before harvest; and No. 6 - two weeks before harvest.

Apples: To control Apple Scab and Powdery Mildew, apply 25 to 45 lbs. per acre. Dust thoroughly between periods of rainfall. Repeat as necessary to cover new foliage growth during pink, petal-fall and cover spray period. MacIntosh, Golden Delicious, Jonathan and certain other varieties may be injured by sulphur applications under certain conditions.

Outdoor Flowers, Ornamentals: To control Powdery Mildew, Leaf Spot and Black Spot on Roses, Botrytis Blight on Hydrangea and Red Spiders dust thoroughly and repeat applications as necessary. For disease control, repeat applications on a weekly basis.

Beans: To control Rust and Red Spiders, dust thoroughly at the rate of 15 to 30 lbs per acre. Be sure dust is directed to underside of leaves. Repeat as necessary. For rust control, applications should be made at 7 to 10 day intervals. Do not apply to varieties of beans susceptible to sulphur injury. Do not apply if the temperature during or within 3 days after application is expected to exceed 90 F.

Peanuts: To control Leaf Spot, apply 20 to 25 lbs. per acre at 7 to 10 day intervals or as necessary. Begin dusting when disease first appears and continue to within 1 month of harvest.

Poultry (chickens, turkeys, ducks, geese, game birds, and pigeons): To control deplumming mites, dust liberally to birds and rub into feathers. Apply dust thoroughly to all interior surfaces of poultry houses. Force dust into cracks and crevices. Repeat applications as needed.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Storage: Store pesticide in original container and place in a locked storage area. Opened pesticide containers should be securely resealed prior to storage. Protect from penetration of moisture and excessive heat. Avoid cross contamination with other pesticides or fertilizers. Use caution when storing pesticides in stacks.

Pesticide Disposal: Waste resulting from the use of this product may be disposed of on site or at an approved waste disposal facility.

Container Disposal: Completely empty bag into application equipment. Then dispose of empty bag in a sanitary landfill or by incineration, or if allowed by state and local authorities, by burning. If burned, stay out of smoke.
