Controls Cutworms, Sowbugs on Vegetables and Mole Crickets and Armyworms on Lawns.

ENDIVE (Escarole) (14), KALE (14), PARSLEY (14), SPINACH (14), and SWISS CHARD (14): Apply 40 pounds per acre or 1 lb. per 1000 square feet.

LAWNS, TURF & ORNAMENTALS

To control cutworms, armyworms, crickets, darkling ground beetles, grasshoppers, mole crickets and sowbugs, apply 20 to 40 pounds per acre (1 lb. per 1000 square feet).

LAWNS AND TURF: Treat entire area evenly with a rotary broadcast spreader or similar applicator to obtain uniform coverage, giving particular attention to edges of sidewalks and along porch and patio foundations. For best results, cut lawn, remove clippings and water thoroughly before treatment.

ORNAMENTAL PLANTS: Apply evenly to soil around plants, shrubs and trees at a rate of 1 pound per 1000 square feet. For best results, areas to be treated should be damp.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

STORAGE: Store pesticide in original container and place in a locked storage area. Opened pesticide containers should be securely resealed prior to storage. Protect from penetration of moisture, excessive heat or cold. Avoid cross-contamination with other pesticides or fertilizers. Use caution when storing pesticides in stacks.

PESTICIDE DISPOSAL: Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage or disposal. Wastes resulting from the use of this product may be disposed of on site or at an approved waste disposal facility.

CONTAINER DISPOSAL: Securely wrap original container in several layers of newspaper and discard in trash.

STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT

IF SWALLOWED: Drink 1 or 2 glasses of water and induce vomiting by touching back of throat with finger. Do not induce vomiting or give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. VEGETABLES

SECURITY SEVIN® BAIT will control cutworms, armyworms, crickets, darkling ground beetles, grasshoppers, mole crickets and sowbugs when applied in a broadcast application to the listed vegetables. Repeat applications as necessary. Subsequent planting of food and feed crops in treated soil must be made with crops on this other carbaryl labels. Follow the time intervals between last application and harvest indicated by () following each crop. A (0) indicates product may be used through day of harvest.

CUCUMBERS (0), MELONS (0), PEANUTS (0), SQUASH (0): Apply 20 pounds per acre or 1/2 lb. per 1000 square feet.

PEAS (0), COWPEAS (3): Apply 30 pounds per acre or 3/4 lb. per 1000 square feet.
