SECURITY ROSE & FLOWER DUST CONTROLS THE FOLLOWING INSECTS AND DISEASES ON ROSES, FLOWERS AND SHRUBS: aphids, bagworms, mites, flea beetles, lacebugs, leafhoppers, leafminers, mealybugs, webworms, whiteflies, tent caterpillars, scale crawlers, powdery mildew, leaf spot and black spot

Apply by dusting in early morning or late evening when the temperature is low and the air is still. Do not treat during excessively high temperature (above 85°F) or foliar burn may occur. Apply so all exposed plant parts are contacted, especially upper and lower leaf surfaces.

FOR INSECT CONTROL: Treat thoroughly when damage or insects first appear. Repeat as necessary.

FOR DISEASE CONTROL: Start a regular preventative program of treatments as soon as foliage appears. Under normal conditions, apply every 7 to 10 days during growing season. Treat at least weekly during periods of moderate infection and twice weekly during periods of rapid new growth or severe infection caused by high humidity or continuous summer rains. Reapply after irrigation or rainfall.

NOTE: Do not use on ferns, poinsettias, hibiscus or gardenias or injury may occur. Do not use within 10 days of an oil spray.

HANDY REFILLABLE SQUEEZE DUSTER. This container is also a squeeze applicator. To dust, lift hinged cap and squeeze container. Hold duster 8 to 10 inches from the plant receiving the dust and cover the entire plant with a thin film of dust. To refill container, remove bottom closure. Refill duster only with SECURITY Brand Rose & Flower Dust.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage and disposal. Store pesticide in original container and place in a locked storage areas. When empty container is discarded, wrap container in several layers of newspaper and place in trash collection.
