To control fleas and brown dog ticks on premises, thoroughly spray infested areas, pet beds, resting quarters, under cracks and crevices, along and behind baseboards, moldings, window and door frames, and localized areas of floor and floor covering. Fresh bedding should be placed in animal quarters following treatment. Concurrent treatment of animals is recommended. Repeat treatment as needed.

This product may be used indoors, outdoors or in greenhouses throughout the growing season, or as a preventive treatment when other insecticides are prohibited due to residue restrictions and use limitations. This product can be applied on day of harvest.

To control the insect listed, direct the spray to cover the insect pest and also the upper and lower leaf surfaces. Repeat treatment as soon as insects appear. Make one spray application per week. Repeat applications as needed to control infestations.
