

Make application after first sprinkling area to be treated with water or when flowers or grass are damp after rainfall or dew has settled. Apply F&B Tobacco Dust thoroughly to both sides of moistened leaf surfaces sufficiently so as to insure contact of the dust with the bodies of insects. Apply 1 lb. to approximately 50 sq. ft. of area to be treated. Repeat application at 7-10 day intervals.
