PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS

HAZARDS TO HUMANS AND DOMESTIC ANIMALS

STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT

If In Eyes: Flush with plenty of water. Call a physician. Wear goggles or face shield when handling. Wash thoroughly with soap and water after handling. Remove contaminated clothing and separately launder clothing before reuse.

Mixers/loaders when mixing and loading this product must wear a long-sleeved shirt and long pants or a coverall that covers all parts of the body except the head, hands and feet. Wear chemical resistant gloves, goggles or a face shield and chemically resistant apron.

Fieldworkers and harvesters must wear chemical resistant gloves. Leather or fabric gloves are not acceptable.

A dust mask must be worn when mixing and loading this product.

AFTER WORK: Take off all clothes and shoes. Shower using soap and water. Do not wear contaminated clothing. Wash protective clothing and

equipment with soap and water after each use. Personal clothing worn during use must be laundered separately from household articles. Clothing and protective equipment heavily contaminated or drenched with captan must be destroyed according to state and local regulations.

During application only, from a tractor with a completely enclosed cab or from an aircraft with an enclosed cockpit a long sleeved shirt and long-legged pants must be worn. Chemically resistant gloves must be available in the cab or cockpit and worn while exiting.

**RE-ENTRY STATEMENT**

Do not apply this product in such a manner as to directly or through drift expose workers or other persons. The area being treated must be vacated by unprotected persons. Do not allow persons to enter treated areas within 4 days following application unless a long-sleeved shirt and long pants or a coverall that covers all parts of the body except the head, hands and feet and chemically resistant gloves are worn. Because certain states may require more restrictive re-entry intervals for various crops treated with this product, consult your State Department of Agriculture for further information.

**GENERAL DIRECTIONS**

Apply on first appearance of diseases. Dust to thoroughly cover all parts of plants. Repeat application at 4 to 7 day intervals as needed to maintain control.

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STRAWBERRIES - Fruit Rot (Botrytis Cinerea) . . . . .	25
Make application as soon as possible after each rainy period, but no more than 2 during each 14 day period. During wet bloom period make 3 to 4 applications; 2 to 3 applications if bloom period is dry. No application during harvest is required.	

APRICOTS, PEACHES - Brown rot . . . . .	30 to 50
Apricots - apply at red bud stage and repeat at 85% petal fall. Peaches - apply in the blossom and pre-harvest applications.	

CUCURBITS (Cantaloupe, Cucumbers) - Angular Leaf Spot, Anthracnose, Downy Mildew. . . . .	20 to 30*
*On young plants, increasing to 30 to 38 lbs. per acre on mature plants. Start applications when runners begin to form or at first sign of disease.	

TOMATOES - Early and Late Blight, Anthracnose, Grey Leaf Spot, Septoria Leaf Spot . . . . .	30 to 40*
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\*On young plants; 40 to 50 lbs. per acre on mature plants. Make weekly applications.

**STORAGE AND DISPOSAL**

**STORAGE:** Store in a cool, dry place.

**DISPOSAL:** Do not contaminate water, food, or feed by storage or disposal. Wastes resulting from the use of this product may be disposed of on site or at an approved waste disposal facility.

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#### POTATO - SEED PIECE TREATMENT

DAMPING OFF, SEED ROT, BROWN EYE DISEASE, VERTICILLIUM WILT

Use at rate of 10 oz. per bushel of cut seed pieces, or 16 oz. (1 lb.) to 100 lbs. of cut seed pieces.

Apply in convenient container or by duster attachment over belt. Coat each seed piece evenly with a light film of dust.

Treat pieces within 6 hours of cutting. If the planting is delayed, store treated seed pieces in open crates, where there is a good air movement, for two days before bagging.

DO NOT USE TREATED SEED FOR FOOD OR FEED PURPOSES.

Mark bags TREATED SEED PIECES.
