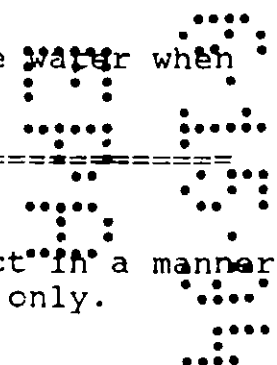

GO-WEST SLUG KILLER controls slugs and snails in the lawn and garden. Begin applications as early as February and continue with treatments as needed into the fall.

HOW TO USE: SHAKE WELL BEFORE USING.

1. Connect spray nozzle to garden hose. Be sure that valve is in "off" position.
2. Attach dip tube to the spray nozzle.
3. Remove cap and screw bottle onto nozzle. Turn on water.
4. Switch valve to "on" position to start flow of water. Use valve to shut off flow of water at any time.
5. Spray directly over area requiring application evenly and uniformly.

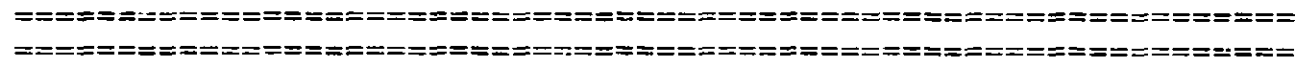
SPRINKLING CAN

Mix 3 ounces (6 tablespoons) GO-WEST SLUG KILLER per gallon of water. Apply to 125 sq. ft. (an area approximately 12 feet by 10 feet).

HOSE-END SPRAYER

Use 3 ounces (6 tablespoons) GO-WEST SLUG KILLER for each gallon of water delivered by your sprayer. Apply one gallon of this mixture to 125 sq. ft. (an area approximately 12 feet by 10 feet).

For complete control, cover entire area. GO-WEST SLUG KILLER should be applied in the evening as slugs feed mostly at night. Re-apply after two weeks or after heavy rain. DO NOT USE ON VEGETABLE GARDENS.

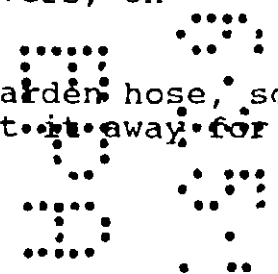
What is this product? And what will it do?

Lilly/Miller GO-WEST SLUG KILLER stops these pests from devouring your favorite flowers, sliding across your lawn, and covering your driveway or patio. It goes on quickly and easily reaches those hard-to-bait areas under shrubs, in ground covers, on hillsides, and in rock gardens.

This easy-to-use container attaches right to your garden hose, so there's no mixing. Use only what you need, then put it away for next time.

How do I use this product?

When to use: Snails and slugs can be active all through the year, if conditions are right. The damage they cause is most visible as gardens get into full swing in early spring. During hot



weather, they are often forced to find protection from the heat, but you will see their damage increase as rains return in the fall. To keep snails and slugs under control for the entire season, spray with Lilly/Miller GO-WEST SLUG KILLER every two weeks.

Snails and slugs prefer moist areas during the day and come out of hiding at night. Spray in the evenings, just before dark.

What to do: Slugs hide under pots, fallen leaves, boards, and any other debris left around the yard. Get rid of as many of these hiding places as possible, before you start spraying. In the evening, spray around flowers, shrubs and trees. Mulched beds and barkdust areas are good hiding places for snails and slugs. Be sure to spray these places.

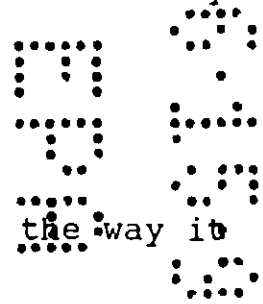
How to use this sprayer:

1. Before you start, the gold knob should be pointing away from the triangle on the spray head. If it cannot be turned, push it out from the back. The red knob should be in the OFF position.
2. Shake the container well and attach it to your garden hose.
3. Turn on the water from the faucet.
4. When you are ready to spray, turn the gold knob so that it points at the triangle on the spray head and push it in.
5. Turn the red knob one-quarter turn and begin spraying.
6. When you are finished spraying or if you have to stop spraying at any time, turn the red knob back to the OFF position.
7. Push the gold knob out from the back and turn it. This seals the container.
8. Turn off the water from the faucet.
9. Turn the red knob ON then OFF, to drain the water from the hose.
10. Unhook the container from the hose and store it carefully or throw it away.

2. When you are ready to spray
3. When you are finished

This product may separate, but this does not affect the way it works. Simply, shake well before using.

This whole bottle will cover 1,000 sq. ft. (50'x 20'). One quarter of the bottle (see markings on the side) will cover 250

sq. ft. (10'x 25'). Let the spray dry before you let adults, children or pets back onto the area.

What not to do: Do not spray GO-WEST SLUG KILLER on vegetables or in the vegetable garden. Do not allow the product to form puddles which may attract pets. Do not let adults, children, or pets onto the area until the spray has dried.

What will I see?

GO-WEST SLUG KILLER does not drop snails and slugs in their tracks. They often crawl away a bit to die, so you will not see mounds of these pests lying about.

But, you will not see snails and slugs on the patio each evening and you will not hear them crunch or squish underfoot. Your flower seedlings will live to adulthood, and there will be fewer holes in the leaves of all the ornamental plants in your garden.
