"To distribute or sell" is defined under FIFRA section 2(gg) and its implementing regulation at 40 CFR 152.3.

What is this product? And what will it do?

Blackberry & Brush Killer kills blackberry vines, plus many kinds of brush and unwanted woody plants. This product can be used in many places around your yard, such as along fences and driveways, under decks, around patios and buildings, or in driveways and parking areas. The area can be planted again just a few weeks after spraying.

Blackberry & Brush Killer will also prevent woody plants from sending up sprouts from the roots, once they are cut down.

Once the brush is gone, the area may be replanted.
