NET WEIGHT

To control fleas and ticks on cats and dogs. Cost liberally over entire animal, avoiding the eyes, and rubbing thoroughly to skin. Comb out dead ticks a few hours after treatment. Repeat at weekly intervals if needed. Do not treat nursing animals, small puppies, kittens under 4 weeks of age, or animals in a weakened condition.

In and around dog and cat quarters to control ticks and fleas — Dust in and around sleeping quarters, kennels and dog houses by means of shaker can or duster. Force dust into cracks and crevices. Repeat at weekly intervals as necessary to maintain control. When treating animals quarters do not contaminate feed, water, or utensils. When treating animal quarters, inside dwellings, apply in such a manner that small children cannot come in contact with dust. Do not treat bedding or quarters occupied by nursing animals, animals in a weakened condition, kittensunder 4 weeks old, or young puppies.

Horn flies on Horses: Rub 2 ounces per animal into hair on back and neck. Repeat as necessary, but not more often than once every 4 days.
