Maintain balt supply for at least 15 days. Continue balting until all signs of feeding have stopped. Balt placements should be checked daily and replace consumed, contaminated or spoiled balts. The balts being replaced should immediately be disposed of in such a manner to prevent ingestion by children, pets, wildlife, and domestic animals.

Balt placement should be kept permanently to prevent new infestation.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

PROHIBITIONS: Do not contaminate water, food, or feed by storage or disposal.


STORAGE: Store in original container in dry, cool area separately from fertilizer, feed, or foodstuffs and away from products with strong odors. Splilage should be carefully swept up and collected for disposal.
