

DIRECTIONS

Hand Washing or Immersion Machines

1. Dissolve 1 oz. BONCHEM EGG WASH in each 3 gallons of water at 110 to 130° F. Maintain wash solution at even temperature. Very dirty eggs may require slightly stronger solutions.
2. Immerse eggs for not more than 3 minutes. Rinse with potable water.
3. Remove from water and drain eggs dry. Place in proper storage immediately.
4. Do not wash more than 5 dozen eggs per gallon of solution. Change solution oftener if it becomes dirty.

Separate Rinse

If separate rinse is used add 1 oz. BONCHEM EGG WASH for each 5 gallons of rinse water at a temperature slightly higher than washing solution but not above 140° F. Rinse eggs with potable water and drain.

Sodium Metasilicate pentahydrate	15%
n-Alkyl (C ₁₄ , 50%, C ₁₂ , 40%, C ₁₆ , 10%) dimethyl benzyl ammonium chloride	5%

Inert Ingredients	60%
Total	100%

DIRECTIONS

Spray and Tank-Type Machines

1. Charge wash tank with 1 oz. BONCHEM EGG WASH for each 3 gallons of water at 110 to 130° F. Follow machine manufacturers directions.
2. Wash for 1 to 3 minutes depending on amount of soil. Rinse with potable water.
3. Drain eggs dry.
4. Place eggs in proper storage immediately.

Egg Processing Plants

For handling heavy loads of eggs use 1/2 to 1 oz. BONCHEM EGG WASH per gallon of solution for charging the wash tank of machine. Add BONCHEM EGG WASH during the day's run as needed.
