DIRECTIONS FOR USE:

Skin applications for mosquitos, biting flies, gnats, and fleas. Shake about 12 drops into one hand, rub hands together, and apply thoroughly in a thin layer to all areas of exposed skin, much as in washing. Sufficient repellent should be applied to give a uniform film. Avoid contact with eyes and lips.

Clothing treatments against biting insects such as, chiggers (mites), fleas and ticks. When clothing cannot be impregnated with bulk repellent, apply by pouring a dozen drops into one hand, rub the hands together, and then rub lightly on the socks and other clothing. Make liberal applications along all openings of the clothing, such as inside the neck band, and the fly and bottom of trousers, and where clothing fits tightly as across the shoulders, elbows, hips, and knees. Repeat smearing process several times until about 2 ounces of repellent have been used. One treatment of clothing is effective for several days if repellent is not washed away. Clothing may be treated the day before wearing. If irritation develops, discontinue wearing treated clothing. Will not damage nylon, cotton and wool. Do not apply to rayon, spandex, Dynel or Verel.

CAUTION: For External Use Only. Harmful if swallowed. Avoid contact with eyes or lips. Do not expose treated surfaces near fire or flame.

May damage furniture finishes, plastics, and painted surfaces.
