How to Use

1. Remove protective valve cap.
2. Under each protective cap will be found two (2) valve releases. The blue one with the extended lockable arm is used to release the entire contents of this aerosol. The white one is a push-button type to be used to release any desired amount of the aerosol.
3. A third valve release called the "Leg Dispenser" is intended to fog elevator legs. The leg dispenser permits perpendicular release of this aerosol fog through the 1/4 inch holes presently used to inject spot fumigants. These leg dispensers are furnished free of charge on request from the E. H. Leitte Company.

WARNING

DO NOT WET SPRAY NEAR OPEN FLAMES. Avoid contamination of foodstuffs. Foods should be removed or covered during treatment. All food processing surfaces should be covered during treatment or thoroughly cleaned before using. When using the product in these areas, apply only when processing is not in operation.

Contents under pressure. DO NOT puncture. Exposure to high temperature may cause bursting. Keep at room temperatures away from stoves, radiators, etc. Never throw empty containers in fire or incinerators.

FOG

For fogging of loaded railroad box cars; empty bulk flour storage bins and transports; open space areas of mill proper, blending, wheat cleaning and warehouses. Also for close proximity wet misting inside of processing equipment.

CONTROLS

The following exposed insects: Cornet Beetle, Confused Flour Beetle, Spider Beetle, Flat Grain Beetle, Longhorned Grain Beetle, Granary Weevil, Indian Meal Moth, Mediterranean Flour Moth and Eggs.

Directions

RAILROAD BOX CARS - Considering the average construction and the tightness of box cars, the entire contents of this aerosol is required. Using the blue valve release with the lockable arm, place the aerosol on the floor of the car or if the car is filled with foodstuffs packed in multi-wall paper bags - wedge the aerosol between sacks on the top of the pile, so that the fog shoots towards the center of the ceiling. AVOID WETTING OF SACKS. In the event a strong wind is blowing at the time of release - seal the upwind car door with 2 inch masking tape to reduce draft and permit uniform distribution of the fog.

PROCESSING, WAREHOUSE, LABORATORY AND OFFICE AREAS require a release time of 10 seconds for every 1,000 cubic feet to control crawling insects and a release time of 5 seconds per 1,000 cubic feet to control flying insects. For large areas uniformly place and release the entire contents of this aerosol at the rate of one (1) aerosol for every 5,000 cubic feet to control crawling insects and one (1) aerosol for every 20,000 cubic feet of space to control flying insects.

FLOUR PROCESSING EQUIPMENT in general requires a 5 second release per point of application; however when fogging elevator legs a 10 second release is required due to air currents within the legs. The most effective points of application are just below the head and midway between the elevator head and foot of each leg. Special leg dispensers are provided together with instructions on request.

EMPTY BULK FLOUR TRANSPORTS require a release time of 10 seconds for every 1,000 cubic feet to control crawling insects and 5 seconds for every 1,000 cubic feet to control flying insects. e.g. Railroad bulk flour cars contain approximately 3,000 cubic feet. For crawling insects hold the white push button valve release open for 30 seconds and for flying insects hold the valve open for 15 seconds.
