WHEN TO APPLY

This mulch contains preemergent herbicides and for best results, remove all weeds in the beds prior to applying Preen Mulch. Apply anytime in the spring and fall after renovating beds. For best results, apply Preen Mulch after flowers and ornamentals have been planted into the soil. Do not apply over flower seeds.

Ornamental Bulbs - Apply 2 to 4 weeks after planting, or before or after flowering. Do not apply to bulbs when flowering.

HOW TO APPLY

Bulbs and Perennials — Spread Preen Mulch over the area to a depth of two inches. Do not plant flowers directly into mulch. If additional planting is desired after Preen Mulch has been applied, first remove the mulch from the selected area. Avoid getting treated mulch in the planting hole. Once the plant is firmly embedded in the soil, replace the mulch around the plant.

Annuals — After plants have been set in the soil bed, spread Preen Mulch over the area to a depth of two inches. Make no more than one application per site per year.

The active ingredient in Preen Mulch can cause injury to some annuals. If you have a concern about damage to your annuals, do not use this product.
