

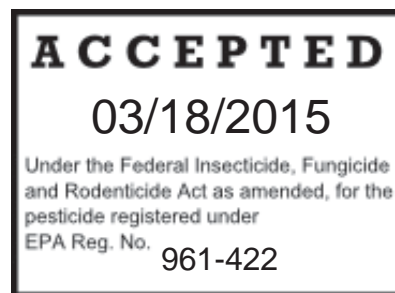

[PREEN LANDSCAPE MULCH PLUS 3 or This product] is regionally formulated from 1 forest products such as hardwood, pine, cedar, eucalyptus and cypress or combination thereof plus [colorant and] two long-lasting preemergence herbicides and an insecticide.

One application of [PREEN LANDSCAPE MULCH PLUS 3 or this product] provides [up to] 6 month[s] control of listed broadleaf weeds and annual grasses in flower and ornamental beds. It also provides control of listed insects in flower beds, and around ground covers, trees and shrubs. Mulch deprives weeds of the sunlight they need to grow. Plus it helps landscaped areas retain moisture – protecting your plants, trees and shrubs from extreme temperatures.

PRODUCT RESTRICTIONS

Wear gloves when handling.

Do not apply near fish pools, ponds, streams or lakes.

Do not use this mulch around food producing fruit or nut trees, vegetable[s]gardens, herbs, or other edible food plants.

WHEN TO APPLY [PREEN LANDSCAPE MULCH PLUS 3]

Apply [PREEN LANDSCAPE MULCH PLUS 3 or this product] during the growing season for control of listed weeds and insects. For best results, apply [PREEN LANDSCAPE MULCH PLUS 3 or this product] after flowers and ornamentals have been planted into the soil. Do not apply over flower seeds.

HOW TO APPLY [PREEN LANDSCAPE MULCH PLUS 3]

[PREEN LANDSCAPE MULCH PLUS 3 or this product] does not kill existing weeds, for best results you must first remove all existing weeds and any new weeds that have begun to grow.

Bulbs and Perennials - Spread [PREEN LANDSCAPE MULCH PLUS 3 or this product] over the area to a depth of two inches. Do not plant flowers directly into mulch. If additional planting is desired after [PREEN LANDSCAPE MULCH PLUS 3 or this product] has been applied, first remove the mulch from the selected area. Avoid getting treated mulch in the planting hole. Once the plant is firmly embedded in the soil, replace the mulch around the plant.

Annuals – After plants have been set in the soil bed, spread [PREEN LANDSCAPE MULCH PLUS 3 or this product] over the area to a depth of two inches. The active ingredients in [PREEN LANDSCAPE MULCH

PLUS 3 or this product] can cause injury to some annuals. If you have a concern about damage to your annuals, do not use this product.
