

Subject: Amendment - Change to can & booklet labeling LACCO Diazinon AG-500 EPA Registration No. 962-402 Your Application Received June 5, 1984

The amendment referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (PIFRA) is acceptable, provided that you make the labeling changes listed below before you release the product for shipment bearing the amended labeling:

- 1. The submitted label is the old version of November 15, 1982, which dows not bear the corrections detailed on the Notice of Registration and complied with by your company or February 7, 1983. Use these corrected labels as the basis for future revisions and submissions.
- 2. Now that the label does not wrap around on itself, the column order will be incorrect. The citrus snow scale should follow the citrus fruits section,
- 3. It might be better to leave off the specific directions entirely from the can label rather than present 2 disjointed panels that do not follow each other and lack the headings and crop designations (citrus fruit section).
- 4. Revise the diazinon declaration to Diazinon [0,0-Diethyl 0-(2isopropy1-6-methy1-4-pyrimidiny1)phosphorothioate].
- 5. Update the Storage and Disposal section per PR Notice 83-3. Note that this product requires the "Pesticides wastes are toxic" pesticide disposal paragraph due to the solvent.
