Protection against screw worms. Spray wounds caused by shear cuts, castration, dehorning, dog bites, wire cuts and docking as soon as possible to help avoid screw worm infestation. Repeat after 7 days if wound is not completely healed.

Treatment of screw worm infestation in superficial wounds. Spray directly into and one inch around infested wounds, also drainage area below wound. Repeat treatment twice weekly until wound is healed.

Fleece worms and other secondary blow flies. Spray the infested wounds and area 2 or 3 inches around wound. Repeat when necessary.

Shake well before application. Release spray by pressure of forefinger on nozzle on top of can. Direct spout and spray away from you. Avoid spray contact with face or eyes. Hold 3 inches from wound and spray until completely wet. Pause until foaming ceases and then spray again into and around wound.

Do not use more than necessary on wounds. Use extra precautions treating newborn calves, regardless of location
