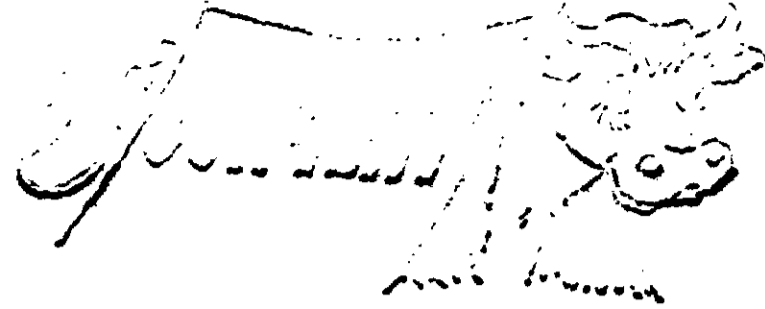

**ACTIVE INGREDIENTS:**

- Pyrethrins
- 2,4-Dichlorophenyl butyrate, technical
- 41-66071 bicyclopentene dicarboximide
- 2,3,4,5-tetra (2-butyleno) tetrahydro-2-furancaryle
- Technical chlordane
- Residuals of .03% (butylcarbitol) (3-propylpiperonyl) ether and .02% other related compounds.
- Anti-lice insecticide synergist, U.S. Pat. Nos. 2,545,203 and 2,545,267.
- Anti-repellent II, U.S. Pat. No. 2,613,116.

Kills and repels horn flies, stable flies, mosquitoes and gnats. When properly applied, the repellent effect against above insects will last two days.

**DIRECTIONS FOR USE:**

READ AND FOLLOW CAREFULLY DIRECTIONS AND CONDITIONS OF SALE, INCLUDING THE LABELING AND DETERMINATION OF ANIMAL PROVISION, BEFORE USING DAIRY CATTLE SPRAY.

For control of horn fly, stable fly, mosquito and gnat infestation on dairy cattle, apply 1 to 2 ounces of DAIRY CATTLE SPRAY to each animal for a three day period. The spray should be applied with a good knapsack or power sprayer so that the animal is thoroughly wetted. Special care should be taken in spraying the head, neck, and shoulders. Avoid areas around the nose, eyes and mouth. Avoid spraying the udder. Repeat at the same interval every three days for the first three weeks and every two weeks thereafter until the season is over. Be sure the cows are clean and dry at all times prior to milking. Cows should be sprayed very lightly every day instead of attempting to build a residual repellency by spraying more heavily.

For control of lice, apply the animal with 2 ounces of DAIRY CATTLE SPRAY. Immediately rub the spray into the hair, paying particular attention to infested areas. Repeat as necessary, but not more frequently than once every three weeks.

To kill flies, mosquitoes and gnats in the barn prior to milking, close all doors and windows and spray the barn thoroughly.
