The Agency, in accordance with the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), as amended, has completed reviewing all of the information submitted with your application to support the reregistration of the above referenced product in connection with the pyrethrins, piperonyl butoxide, and MGK 264nxcz REDs, and has concluded that your submission is acceptable.

NOTE: This product is not being reregistered under sections 3(c)5 and 4(g) of FIFRA at this time.

Please be reminded that 40 CFR Part 156.140(a)(4) requires that a batch code, lot number, or other code identifying the batch of the pesticide distributed and sold be placed on non-refillable containers. The code may appear either on the label or durably marked on the container itself, and can be added by non-notification per PRN 98-10.

Please note that the record for this product currently contains the Confidential Statements of Formulation (CSFs) listed below. Any previously dated CSFs are superseded.

A copy of your label stamped "Accepted" is enclosed along with copies of the acute toxicity and product chemistry reviews completed for the subject product. HAZARDS TO HUMANS AND DOMESTIC ANIMALS

CAUTION

Harmful if absorbed through skin. Causes moderate eye irritation. Avoid contact with skin, eyes, or clothing. Remove and wash contaminated clothing before reuse. Wash thoroughly with soap and water after handling and before eating, drinking, chewing gum, using tobacco or using the toilet.

ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS

This pesticide is toxic to aquatic organisms, including fish and invertebrates. To protect the environment, do not allow pesticide to enter or run off into storm drains, drainage ditches, gutters or surface waters. Applying this product in calm weather when rain is not predicted for the next 24 hours will help to ensure that wind or rain does not blow or wash pesticide off the treatment area.

This pesticide is highly toxic to bees exposed to direct treatment on blooming crops or weeds. Do not apply this product or allow it to drift to blooming crops or weeds while bees are actively visiting the treatment area.

PHYSICAL OR CHEMICAL HAZARDS

Contents under pressure. Do not use or store near heat or open flame. Do not puncture or incinerate container. Exposure to temperatures above 130°F may cause bursting.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal Law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

Do not use in commercial food/feed processing, preparation, and food/feed storage or serving areas.

Remove or cover dishes, utensils, food processing equipment, and food preparation surfaces, or wash them before use.

Remove or cover exposed food and drinking water before application.

Do not allow adults, children, or pets, to enter the treated area until sprays have dried.

Do not apply this product in a way that will contact adults, children, or pets, either directly or through drift.

Avoid contamination of food and feedstuffs.

Remove pets, birds, and cover fish aquariums before use.

Do not make outdoor applications during rain.

For Control of Nests of Wasps, Yellow Jackets, and Hornets: Outdoor use is restricted to nests on building surfaces or structures. The best time to spray the nest is in the early morning or late evening, when air temperature is cooler, most insects are in the nest, and little activity is observed around the nest opening. Spray only if the air is still. Do not make applications during rain. Stand at a safe distance from the nest, not directly under it. Hold container upright at arms length, point the actuator at the nest, and first spray in the opening of the nest. Then spray the rest of the nest until it is saturated. Treated insects may fall out of the nest and die. Any insects returning to the nest after treatment will be killed. Wait 48 hours before removing the nest. Hose off inadvertently sprayed foliage of desirable plants. Do not water the treated area to the point of run-off.

This product may stain or adversely affect vinyl, painted, and plastic surfaces. Avoid application to asphalt roofing shingles as staining may occur. Before using in areas where spray may contact these surfaces, test in an inconspicuous area and recheck in a few hours.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Do not contaminate water, food, or feed by storage and disposal.

Pesticide Storage

Store in a cool, dry area. Always store pesticides in the original container. Store away from food or pet food.

Pesticide Disposal and Container Handling

Do Not Puncture or Incinerate!
