## INGREDIENTS

The solution in this can is a concentrate and must be diluted as directed before use. Oil or water may be used. Oil solutions are more effective and have a longer residual effect and oil should be used as the diluent when logs are sprayed. Oil is also more effective in spraying stacked lumber, but water dilution may also be used.

### FOR SPRAYING LOGS OR LUMBER

Add one gallon of Ambrocide to 28 gallons of kerosene, diesel fuel or No. 2 fuel oil and stir thoroughly. If water is used the same dilution ratio should be used with stirring and agitation to form an emulsion. Emulsions should be agitated frequently when in mixing tank or sprayer tank. Make sure that the mixture is free of sediment, debris or anything else which might clog the spray nozzle. Strain the solution if necessary, when pouring into the sprayer tank.

Logs should be sprayed promptly after felling. Spray thoroughly all parts of the log, wetting bark and ends. Unsprayed parts of the log are points of entrance for insects. One gallon of spray per 100 square feet of log surface is usually required. For added sapstain control when logs are sprayed with oil dilution, add one gallon Penta Plus 40 to 27 gallons diesel fuel or other oil diluent mentioned above and add this mixture to one gallon of Ambrocide.

For added sapstain control of lumber when spraying with water dilution, mix 1 1/2 gallons PQ-57 with 27 gallons water and add this mixture to one gallon of Ambrocide.

Ambrosia Beetle Control — Add one gallon of Ambrocide to each 100 gallons of antistain solution. Ambrocide may be added after the Permatox or PQ stain/mold control solutions are prepared.

### FOR DIPPING LUMBER

Ambrosia Beetle Control — Add one gallon of Ambrocide to each 100 gallons of solution in the dip tank. Ambrocide may be added after the Permatox or PQ stain/mold control solutions are prepared. Add direct to the mixing tank or dip tank and agitate to form emulsion.

Lycids Beetle Control — Add 4 gallons of Ambrocide to each 100 gallons of antistain solution as described above. Dipping solution to which Ambrocide has been added should be stirred or agitated after it has been allowed to stand overnight or for several hours and stirred before using.

Application dated November 8, 1983

The amendment referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), is acceptable, provided that you make the labeling changes listed below before you release the product for shipment bearing the amended labeling:

1. Do not delete "and wildlife" from the environmental hazards as this is required text.
2. In the protective clothing required statements for applicators, add "water resistant hat." Also add "mixers/loaders must wear goggles or face shield, waterproof apron, and waterproof gloves."
3. Add the following to the hazards to humans section, "wash thoroughly after handling and before eating or smoking."

Submit five (5) copies of your revised final printed labeling before you release the product for shipment with the amended labeling.

A standard copy of the label is enclosed for your records.
