INGREDIENT STATEMENT

2,4,5-trichlorophenol		0.095%	
Pentachlorophenol		0.048%	
Total Inert Ingredients		99.857%	

DAILY MAINTENANCE

Sweep floor with buffing or dust mop treated with VESCO-LITE as often as required to control dust. Stubborn rubber burns on sealed wood floors may be removed by rubbing with a clean cloth moistened with VESCO-LITE. Dust cloths treated with VESCO-LITE may be used for cleaning and polishing desks, woodwork and lockers.

NOTE: Do not use VESCO-LITE or VESCO-LITE treated mops on unwaxed asphalt, rubber tile or linoleum floors.

APPLICATION

Hang mop off floor away from wall. Spray or pour required amount of VESCO-LITE along saddle and let mop hang overnight so that VESCO-LITE can penetrate strands. **Treated dust mops should leave no streaks on the floor.** This is a sign too much VESCO-LITE has been used. The exact amount of VESCO-LITE required to retain dirt without leaving moisture streaks varies with type, make, age and condition of mop. Average amounts are shown in table below, but the exact quantity necessary should be separately determined in each case.

MOP CARE

Wash mops which have become dirt saturated with detergent and water.

CAUTION: KEEP OUT OF THE REACH OF CHILDREN. Harmful if swallowed. Avoid prolonged contact with skin.
