DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling. Sanitizing Dairy Equipment: After cleaning and before use, sanitize all milk contact surfaces with a 200 ppm solution of Liquatone as required by state and local health authorities. Contact time should be at least two minutes. Drain thoroughly and air dry.

Udder Washing: Prepare a sanitizing solution by mixing 1/8 ounce (3.7 mL) Liquatone in I gallon (3.8 L) warm $(100^{\circ}\text{F}, 43^{\circ}\text{C})$ water. Use a clean single service towel for each cow. Wash and massage teats and udder. Never dip used towel back into solution. Discard solution if visibly dirty. Prepare fresh solution for each milking. Dry teats and udder with clean single service towel prior to attachment of milking machine.

Sanitizing Hoof Trimming Equipment: Before and after use on each animal, the hoof trimming equipment and utensils should be washed with detergent and warm water. Then sanitize with a 200 ppm solution of active quaternary by mixing 1 ounce of Liquatone in 8 gallons (30 L) of water, Scrub or dip equipment into the solution and allow to drain.

DO NOT USE AS A TEAT DIP

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Do not contaminate food or feed by storage, disposal or cleaning of equipment. Storage: Store in a cool, bry area away from direct sunlight. KEEP FROM FREEZING: If frozen, separation may occur. Thaw completely and mix well prior to use. In case of spill, flood area with large quantities of water.

Pesticide Disposal: Pesticide wastes are acutely hazardous. Improper disposal of excess pesticide, spray mixture, or rinsate is a violation of Federal law.
