Your Amendment Received December 7, 1987

The amendment referred to above, submitted in connection with the Label Improvement Program Notice for Antimicrobial Products Used as Food Contact Surface Sanitizers, is acceptable provided that you:

1. Make the labeling changes listed below before you release the product for shipment bearing the amended labeling.
 - a. The signal word "DANGER" must be placed directly below the heading "Keep Out of Reach of Children."
 - b. Delete "Essential Oil" from the active ingredient statement and adjust your inert percentage accordingly.
 - c. Delete the word "milk."
 - d. Change the words "First Aid" to "Statement of Practical Treatment."
 - e. Under the "Directions for Use" heading, add the misuse statement immediately below to read:

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

- f. Revise the Precautionary Statements to read:

PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS
HAZARDS TO HUMANS AND DOMESTIC ANIMALS

Corrosive. Causes severe eye and skin damage.

Wear goggles or face shield and rubber gloves

to "See side panel for additional precautionary statements."


2. Submit five (5) copies of final printed labeling before you

USE DIRECTIONS

For Cleaning- First remove gross filth and heavy soil deposits.

Lightly Soiled Areas - surfaces to be cleaned should be mopped or brushed
with a solution containing 1 ounce per gallon of water. Rinse cleaned area
with fresh water.

Heavily Soiled Areas - mop or brush soiled surfaces with a solution
containing 2-3 ounces per gallon of water. Rinse cleaned surface with
fresh water.

GENERAL PURPOSE DISINFECTION - Preclean all areas as directed above on all hard, nonporous surfaces in schools, restaurants, rest rooms, or other public areas. Prepare a solution containing 1 1/2 ounces per gallon of water. Mop, spray, brush, or sponge on surface. Allow surface to remain wet for 10 minutes. Prepare a fresh solution daily or when visibly soiled.

To disinfect locker rooms, shower stalls, walkways around pools and other areas where fungicidal action is required, prepare a solution containing 2 ounces in 3 gallons of water. Apply as directed above. This solution will destroy Tricophyton Interdigitale, a causitive agent of athletes foot.

HOSPITAL DISINFECTION - To disinfect walls, floors, furniture, and other hard surfaces in hospitals and nursing homes, preclean as directed above. Prepare a solution containing 2 1/2 ounces per gallon of water. Mop, spray, brush, or sponge on surface. Treated surface must remain wet for 10 minutes. Prepare a fresh solution daily or when visibly soiled.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

- Do Not Contaminate Water, Food or Feed By Storage or Disposal
- Open Dumping is Prohibited
- Do Not Reuse Empty Container
- Do Not Stack Over 6 High In Any Size Container

PESTICIDE DISPOSAL

Wastes resulting from the use of this product may be disposed of on site or at an approved waste disposal facility.

CONTAINER DISPOSAL

Triple Rinse (or equivalent). Then offer for recycling or reconditioning or puncture and dispose of in a sanitary landfill, or for plastic containers if allowed by state and local authorities, by burning. If burned, stay out of smoke.

SANITIZING NON-FOOD CONTACT SURFACES: To sanitize non-food contact surfaces first preclean with a compatible cleaner or this product at the rate or 2-3 ounces per gallon water, followed by a potable water rinse. Prepare a solution of containing 1 ounce per gallon of water. Mop, spray, brush, or sponge on surface and allow to remain wet for at least 2 minutes. Drain excess solution and air dry. Use this procedure for all hard, non-porous surfaces such as floors, walls, tables, etc.

DEODORIZATION: To deodorize surfaces during cleaning, mop or brush surfaces with a solution containing 2 ounces per gallon of water.

DANGER - KEEP OUT OF REACH OF CHILDREN - Causes eye damage and skin irritation. Do Not get in eyes, on skin, or on clothing. Protect eyes and skin when handling. Harmful if swallowed. Avoid contamination of food.

FIRST AID: In case of eye contact, immediately flush eyes with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes, then get medical attention promptly. In case of skin contact, flush skin with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes. Remove and wash contaminated clothing before reuse. If swallowed, drink immediately a large quantity of milk, egg whites, gelatin solution, or if these are not available, drink large quantities of water. Call a physician immediately.
