ANTIDOTE

INTERNAL: ANTIDOTE AND FIRST AID: If any of the insecticide is swallowed, give tablespoonful of salt in glass of warm water and repeat until vomit fluid is clear. Take one or two 1/100 grain atropine tablets, and repeat in one hour if necessary. CALL A PHYSICIAN IMMEDIATELY! If splashed in eyes, wash immediately with water and call physician if irritation persists.

NOTE TO PHYSICIAN: In case of poisoning, atropine is antidotal. Observe patient carefully since repeased treatment may be needed. Symptoms are: Cholinesterase inhibition, headache, lacrination, salivation, labored breathing, vomiting, marked tremors, diarrhea, convlusions. 2-PAM is also antidotal and may be administered in conjunction with atropine.

EXTERNAL: In case of skin contact, wash immediately with soap and water.

This product is for use unly on cotton. Cotton crops which have received late applications of this insecticide should not be grazed by dairy animals or animals being finished for slaughter. Do not make applications within 7 days of picking cotton.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

COTTON PESTS: To control aphids, spider mites, thrips dust at the rate of 10-15 lbs. per acre.

As local conditions may vary, consult your state agricultural experiment station or state extension service specialist for timing of applications and repeat as necessary.
