On the basis of information furnished by the registrant, the above named pesticide is hereby registered/reregistered under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act.

Registration is in no way to be construed as an endorsement or recommendation of this product by the Agency. In order to protect health and the environment, the Administrator, on his motion, may at any time suspend or cancel the registration of a pesticide in accordance with the Act. The acceptance of any name in connection with the registration of a product under this Act is not to be construed as giving the registrant a right to exclusive use of the name or to its use if it has been covered by others.

Based on your response to the 1,2-Benzisothiazolin-3-one RED, the EPA has reregistered this product subject to the comments recorded in the succeeding paragraph. This action is taken under the authority of section 4(g) (2) of the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Acts, as amended. Reregistration under this section does not eliminate the need for continual reassessment of pesticides. The EPA may require submission of data at any time to maintain the registration of the subject product.

1. Make the following label changes:

a. Revise the EPA Registration Number to read "1258-1256."

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- b. As per the acute toxicity review, the word, "PELIIGRO," be added to the Precautionary Hazards statements.
- c. As per the acute toxicity review, the "First Aid" statement should be placed on the label in the following order:

IF IN EYES:.....

IF ON SKIN OR CLOTHING:...

IF INHALED: ... Move to fresh air.

If person is not breathing, call 911 or an ambulance, then give artificial respiration, preferable mouth-to-mouth if possible.

Call a poison control center or doctor for further treatment advice

IF SWALLOWED:.....

- d. As per the acute toxicity review, the additional text below should be added to the "Note to Physician" statement that addresses the eye, skin irritation, and acute inhalation concerns and acute inhalation toxicity to read as follows:
  - -technical information on symptomatology;
  - -use of supportive treatments to maintain life functions;
  - -medicine that will counteract the specific physiological
  - -effects of the pesticide;
- e. As per the acute toxicity review, revise the "Hazards to Humans and Domestic Animals to read as follows:

"DANGER. Corrosive. Causes irreversible eye damage.
Causes skin burns. Fatal if absorbed through skin. Do not
get in eyes, on skin or on clothing. May be fatal if inhaled.
Do not breathe vapor or spray mist. Harmful if absorbed
through the skin or swallowed. Wear protective eyewear(goggles or,
faceshield). Wear coveralls over long-sleeved shirt and long pants,
chemical-resistant footwear plus socks, chemical-resistant
gloves made out of any waterproof material."

f. Add the following text to the "User Safety Requirements" text to read as follows:

"Follow manufacturer's instructions for cleaning/ maintaining PPE. If no such instructions for washables exist, use detergent and hot water. Keep and wash PPE separately from other laundry."

"Discard clothing and other absorbent materials that have been drenched or heavily contaminated "with this product's concentrate. Do not reuse them."

g. As per the acute toxicity review, add the following "User Safety Recommendations" section to read as follows:

#### User Recommendations

User should wash hands before, eating, drinking, chewing gum, using tobacco, or use the toilet.

User should remove clothing/PPE immediately if pesticide gets inside. Then wash thoroughly and put on clean clothing.

Users should remove PPE immediately after handling this product. As soon as possible, wash thoroughly and change into clean clothing.

- h. As per the Product Chemistry review, add the following subheading, "Physical and Chemical Hazards" to the product labeling.
- i. As per the Product Chemistry review, under the subheading, "Physical and Chemical Hazards" section, add a statement regarding the incompatibility of the product with other chemicals (i.e., oxidizing agents) must be added.
- j. Place a box around the "Storage and Disposal" statements for prominence.

If these conditions are not complied with, the registration will be subject to cancellation in accordance with FIFRA sec.6(e). Your release for shipment of the product constitutes acceptance of these conditions.

Submit two (2) copies of the revised labeling bearing the labeling revisions listed above. A stamped copy of the label is enclosed for your records.

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PESTICIDE DISPOSAL: [For containers < 5 gallons] Pesticide wastes are acutely hazardous. Improper disposal of excess pesticide, spray mixture, or rinsate is a violation of Federal Law. If these wastes cannot be disposed of by use according to label instructions contact your State Pesticide or Environmental Control Agency, or the Hazardous Waste representative at the nearest EPA Regional Office for guidance. Triple rinse as follows: Empty remaining contents into application equipment or a mix tank and drain for 10 seconds after the flow begins to drip. Fill the container ¼ full with water and recap. This product is an effective preservative in most aqueous compositions. Typical applications, and the suggested range of concentrations on which trials can be based are:

Latices: Natural and synthetic latices based on acrylate, butadiene, PVA, styrene and other monomers, for use in various applications, e.g., wax, paint, floor polishes, synthetic rubber latices, add 0.1 - 0.3% of this product (based on total weight of product).

Emulsion paints and Stains: for in-can preservation, add 0.1 - 0.3% of this product (based on total weight of product).

Oil-in-water emulsions: "Spin finish" solutions for use in the textile industry. Cutting/rolling oils. Soluble oils\* (metal and engineering industries). \* We suggest that the addition to metal-working fluid concentrates of this product should be limited to 3% maximum. This will give a maximum recommended use level of 0.3% of this product in a 10:1 dilution of the concentrate and reduce the possibility of skin sensitization, add 0.05 - 0.18% of this product (based on total weight of product).

Adhesives: Carboxymethylcellulose (CMC) and derivatives, animal glues, adhesives based on gelatins and latex, add 0.1 - 0.5% of this product (based on total weight of product).

Paper coating compositions: Rosin dispersions. Starch and casein based products, add 0.1 - 0.3% of this product (based on total weight of product).

Pesticide formulations: For product preservation. For ultimate use-dilution protection. This product is exempt from tolerance under 40CFR180.920, materials exempted from the requirements of a tolerance when used in accordance with good agricultural practice as inert (or occasionally active) ingredients in pesticide formulations applied to growing crops only. Based on the current 180.920 limit of 0.1% BIT in formulations, use levels of up to 1% (10,000 ppm) of this product are allowed, add 0.05 - 0.25% of this product (based on total weight of product).

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Under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act as amended, for the pesticide, registered under EPAReg. No. 1258-1256 General Recommendations: The concentration required to give protection depends on several factors. These include susceptibility of the system to microbiological degradation, the extent to which microorganism can gain access, the species involved, pH, temperature, and length of time for which protection is required.

For protection against bacterial attack, a concentration within the range of 0.04 - 0.7% of this product is almost invariably sufficient.

The control of mold growth, particularly on paste products of high solids content, may occasionally demand dosages above 0.5%.

In dilute fluid systems, spoilage is usually controlled with dosages not greater than 0.09%.
