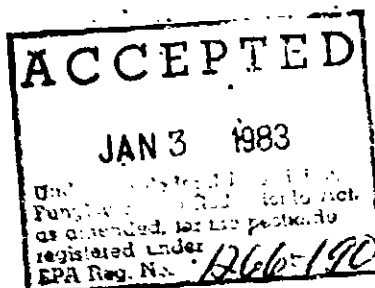
STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT

PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS

HAZARDS TO HUMANS & DOMESTIC ANIMALS

WARNING

Harmful or fatal if inhaled. May displace air in an enclosed area and cause death from suffocation. Use only with adequate ventilation. Avoid breathing of vapors. Avoid contact with eyes or skin. Do not ingest. Keep away from children. Notice to Physicians: Sympathomimetic amine, such as epinephrine, may precipitate arrhythmias. Use only after careful consideration.

ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS

Do not apply directly to water. Do not contaminate water by cleaning of equipment or discharge of wastes.

PHYSICAL OR CHEMICAL HAZARDS

FIRE ANT KILLER should be kept away from flames or other ignition sources such as welding when used where vapors may become concentrated. May generate toxic gases on contact with open flame, hot surfaces, or other heat producing conditions.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

To aid in the control of fire ants, apply FIRE ANT KILLER to the top of the ant mound. Best results are obtained by making a small opening approximately one inch in diameter in the top center of mound through which a measured quantity of FIRE ANT KILLER can be poured. Do not disturb the mound more than necessary when treating to avoid migration of the ants and to obtain a more effective kill.

FOR MOUNDS LESS THAN A FOOT IN DIAMETER: Pour 2 liquid ounces in the small hole in top center of mound.

FOR MOUNDS GREATER THAN A FOOT IN DIAMETER: Pour 2 liquid ounces in a circle around top of mound. Then pour 2 liquid ounces in the small hole in top center of mound.

NOTE: The kill rate of FIRE ANT KILLER varies with temperature. At temperatures below 50°F it may take from one to three weeks to kill all ants in a mound. Kill rate is also affected by excess moisture. Treatment should not be made when the mound is saturated with water. At normal temperatures (68°F - 90°F) a total kill will result in approximately one to eight hours.

All applicable directions, restrictions, and precautions on the label are to be followed. This label must be in possession of the user at the time of pesticide application.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL ← 10 pt.

Prohibitions - Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage or disposal. Open dumping is prohibited.

Pesticide Disposal - Pesticide, spray mixture or rinsate that cannot be used according to label instructions must be disposed of according to Federal or approved state procedures under subtitle C of the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act.

Container Disposal - Reseal container and dispose of in approved landfill or bury in a safe place.
