

OLCOCIDE ROACH SPRAY

An oil solution for indoor application as a contact spray. Use in spot treatment for control of cockroaches, silverfish, ants and silverfish.

ACTIVE INGREDIENTS

Diazinon, O,O-diethyl O-(2-isopropyl-6-methyl-4-pyrimidinyl) Phosphorothioate	0.800%
Piperonyl butoxide technical	0.125%
Pyrethrins	0.080%
Petroleum Distillates	99.325%
TOTAL:	100.000%

*Equivalent to 0.10% of (butyl carbaryl) (0-propylpiperonyl) ether and to 0.025% of related compounds.

STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT

IF SWALLOWED — Call a physician or Poison Control Center immediately. Gastric lavage is indicated if material was taken internally. DO NOT INDUCE VOMITING: vomiting may cause aspiration pneumonia.

IF INHALED — Remove victim to fresh air. Apply artificial respiration if indicated.

IF ON SKIN — Remove contaminated clothing and wash affected areas with soap and water.

IF IN EYES — Flush eyes with plenty of water. Get medical attention immediately.

NOTE TO PHYSICIAN — Solvent presents aspiration hazard. Gastric lavage is indicated if material was taken internally. If symptoms of cholinesterase inhibition are present, atropine sulfate is antidotal. 2-PAM is also antidotal and may be administered in conjunction with atropine.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE: (Cont'd)

For use in dwellings in areas indicated in directions for application, and in certain areas of industrial establishments, such as locker rooms and storage areas, but not in commercial food preparation areas or in edible product areas of food processing plants.

This solution should be applied to the area to be treated by means of a coarse wet spray or by means of paint brush.

ROACHES AND WATERBUGS:

Follow above directions, treating infested cracks and other hiding and resting places, and surfaces near these places, over which roaches will crawl when coming out of hide. Repeat treatment as often as necessary to maintain effective control.

ANTS:

Follow above directions, wet especially door sills, window frames and wherever ants enter premises. Treat openings around water pipes, heat ducts, electric outlets, and baseboards where ants may come into rooms from wall spaces and partitions. Repeat treatment as often as necessary to maintain effective control.

SILVERFISH:

Follow above directions treating especially baseboards, areas behind shelving, bookcases and storage areas.
