

**GENERAL DIRECTIONS**

Use 1/2-oz. to 1-oz. EGG-DU NO. 7 in each 1 1/2-gallons of water. (2 heaping tablespoons = 1-oz.) Temperature should be maintained between 110°F. to 130°F. during entire washing operation.

For larger egg-cleaning machines, use 1/2-lb. to 1-lb. EGG-DU NO. 7 to each 25-gallons water.

Where there is little agitation in the machine, it is good practice to pre-mix 1/2-oz. to 1-oz. of EGG-DU NO. 7 in a quart Mason jar full of warm water and add to the 1 1/4-gallons of 110°F. to 130°F. water in the machine.

Change solution for each washing period, or more often, when the solution becomes dirty through use or if the chlorine odor disappears.
