BEANS-Mexican bean beetle and bean leaf beetle.

PEAS-Pea aphid.

CABBAGE, CAULIFLOWER, and BROCCOLI—Imported cabbi geworm and flea beetles.

CUCUMBER, MELONS, and SQUASH.—Cucumber beelles (striped and spotted).

TOMATO, POTATO, PEPPERS, and EGGPLANT—Fleo beelles and aphids. ASPARAGUS—Asparagus beetle.

RASPBERRIES—Rospberry fruitworm.

Begin applications when the Insects first appear, or before damage is noticeable, and repeat at 5 to 7-day intervals as necessary through the growing season.

DO NOT APPLY TO THE ABOVE NAMED CROPS WITHIN 1 DAY OF HARVEST.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

STORAGE: Store product in original container and in a locked storage area. Do not store with an near feed or food products.

PESTICIDE DISPOSAL: Securely wrop original container in several layers of newspaper and discord in trash.

CONTAINER DISPOSAL: Do not reuse empty bag. Discard bag in trash.
