

NAPHTHALENE

$C_{10}H_8$ White Crystalline compound. Sp. gr. 1.115 (15°C.) N.P. 80°C. B.P. 217.96°C.; soluble in benzene or ether; vaporizes slowly with a coal tar odor acting as a fumigant.

Use as an Insecticide for the Treatment of Bulbs and the Protection of Woolens

Naphthalene has considerable value when used in controlling bulb mites.

Naphthalene is used for preserving bulbs such as: gladiola and tulip bulbs in storing and planting. When storing, remove all dirt, sprinkle Naphthalene between and over each layer of bulbs. Bulbs for storage, put in air-tight container, using one pound of Naphthalene to 25 cubic feet of confined air-tight space. Bulbs should be stored in cool, dry place above freezing temperature.

When planting bulbs in spring or fall, lightly dust a small quantity of Naphthalene around each bulb. This will prevent them from being attacked by wire worms and grubs.

Naphthalene is a soil fumigant against wire worms, grubs, and other similar soil inhabiting organisms.

OTHER USES

Naphthalene is used to protect clothes, furs, carpets, woolens, and other articles which are subject to attack by clothes moths. Clean thoroughly before storing. Since the value of the use of Naphthalene depends on the fumigation effect when in heavy concentration, it is essential that the articles to be protected be kept in containers that are air-tight. Care should be taken that Naphthalene does not come in direct contact with articles that might be stained by the oil in Naphthalene. Naphthalene is used against museum pests in insect and animal collections. Use not less than one pound of Naphthalene to each 50 cubic feet of tightly confined air-tight space.
