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DIRECTIONS FOR WASHING EGGS:

1. Keep pens clean — wash only soiled eggs.
2. Dissolve 1 oz. (1 measure) of Co-op Chlorinated Detergent in each 3 gallons of water (110 -130 F.). Maintain wash solution at even temperature. Very dirty eggs may require stronger solution.
3. For spray-type machines follow manufacturer's directions.
4. For hand washing or immersion-type machine, immerse eggs for 3 minutes. Remove from solution, allow to drain. Do not wash more than 5 dozen eggs per gallon of solution. Change solution oftener if it becomes dirty.
5. If separate rinse is used, add 1 oz. Chlorinated Detergent per 5 gallons of water. Maintain rinse at temperature slightly greater than wash solution.
6. Dry eggs rapidly and store in cool, damp room.

DIRECTIONS FOR GENERAL CLEANING AND SANITIZING:

1. Prepare hot water solution containing 1 oz. of Chlorinated Detergent per 2 gallons of water.
2. Wash feed hoppers, water founts and other equipment thoroughly. In case of disease outbreak, apply fresh solution after cleaning.
3. Wash equipment, walls, and floors of egg handling rooms to REDUCE BACTERIAL CONTAMINATION AND MOLD GROWTH.
