DIRECTIONS FOR USE:

- It is a violation of Federal Law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.
- 1. Be sure articles are thoroughly brushed or cleaned.
- 2. Use one cake for every 20 cubic feet of tightly enclosed space for moth protection; every 10 cu. ft. for mildew protection.
- 3. Open flap, remove moth cake from box. Take off cellophane wrap .. replace cake in box. Punch out all vent holes.
- 4. Attach box at top of garment bag (or hanger) or to a wire, because vapors work downward.
- 5. Check from time to time...replace with new Enoz Moth Cake
- when down to 1/3 of original size. 6. Do not place in contact with plastic items as paradichlorobenzene damages some plastics.
- 7. Do not use with any other moth preventive chemical.
