Purpose

The purpose of this submission is 1) to revise your label in accordance with PR Notices 2001-1 and 2001-6, and 2) to revise your formula under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA)

Label

The labeling submitted with the above letter, under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA) is acceptable, provided you submit one (1) copy of final printed labeling to us, with the following changes, before you ship your product.

- 1. Since "Be Safe!" could be interpreted as implied safety claim, change these words to something like "Be Sure!".
- 2. Because you have reported the flash point of this product as "88 F", you need to add this "Physical or Chemical Hazards" heading and text:

Physical or Chemical Hazards

Combustible. Do not use or store near heat or open flame.

3. We suggest that you bold these words to give them more prominence: "STORAGE AND DISPOSAL", "Storage", "Disposal", "If empty", and "If partly filed".

CSF

We have reviewed your Confidential Statement of Formula (CSF) dated May 23, 2003. Please clarify the relationship between your source and this product. Do you repackage your source or is it actually a starting material?

Existing stocks

Stocks of existing labels may be used for eighteen (18) months.

Consequence for non-compliance

If these conditions are not complied with, the registration will be subject to cancellation in accordance with FIFRA section 6(e). Your release for shipment of the product constitutes acceptance of these conditions.

Application Directions: The mothballs in this container can treat up to 37.5 cubic feet (for 12 oz. box) [40.6 cubic feet. for 13 oz. box; 43.7 cubic feet for 14 oz. box; 50 cubic feet for 16 oz. box; 75 cubic feet. for 24 oz. box]. One ounce or 10 mothballs can treat 3 cubic feet.

Apply product in clean, airtight containers, bags and closets at the following rates:

For (larger) closets and (larger) containers, calculate the volume to be treated by multiplying the height, width, and depth of the space. The proper treatment of larger volumes may require the use of additional containers of ENOZ® Old Fashioned Moth Balls. To insure protections of your cloths use the recommended amount of ENOZ® Old Fashioned Moth Balls.

Post-Application Directions: Keep product in airtight space for a minimum of seven (7) days. Odor dissipates when treated articles are aired.

Re-treatment: Moths are active all year. In order to maintain protection of your garments, replenish mothballs that have dissipated.
