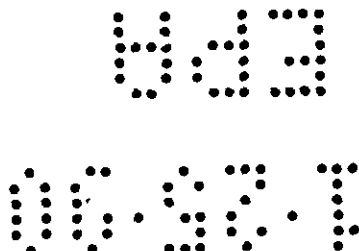

Directions

Thoroughly clean and remove all filth and dirt from premises, surfaces or article to be disinfected. Use a solution made of 1 part Disinfectant mixed with 100 parts water and thoroughly wet all surfaces to be disinfected. Excellent for disinfecting toilet bowls, seat and covers, urinals, wash basins, bath tubs, bed pans, utensils, door knobs, floors and many other articles.

Always clean as directed above before disinfecting.

Keep some of the above disinfectant solution in cuspidors while they are in use.
