On the basis of information furnished by the registrant, the above named pesticide is hereby registered/reregistered under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act. Registration is in no way to be construed as an endorsement or recommendation of this product by the Agency. In order to protect health and the environment, the Administrator, on his motion, may at any time suspend or cancel the registration of a pesticide in accordance with the Act. The acceptance of any name in connection with the registration of a product under this Act is not to be construed as giving the registrant a right to exclusive use of the name or to its use if it has been covered by others.

Based on your response to the Polybutene Reregistration Eligibility Decision, EPA has reregistered the product listed above. This action is taken under the authority of section 4(g)(2)(C) of the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act, as amended. Reregistration under this section does not eliminate the need for continual reassessment of pesticides. EPA may require submission of data at any time to maintain the registration of your product.

The labeling referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), as amended, is acceptable provided that you make the following changes and submit two (2) copies of your final printed labeling before you release the product for shipment:

- 1. Change "CAUTION" to "WARNING" because of the Toxicity II Eye Irritation study.
2. Revise the beginning of the "CONTAINER DISPOSAL" text to read: "IF EMPTY ..."
3. Add these two sentences at the end of your "USE RESTRICTIONS":

DO NOT APPLY WHERE REPELLENT MAY ENTANGLE DESIRABLE BIRD SPECIES: ON OR NEAR BIRD FEEDERS OR ON VEGETATION/ STRUCTURES SUPPORTING FEEDERS.

- 4. Delete the "S" from "ACTIVE INGREDIENTS".
- 5. We prefer that you place the "STORAGE AND DISPOSAL" text after the "APPLICATION DIRECTIONS".

Note that a condition for the re-registration of this product as an **unclassified** product, as explained in our January 5, 2000, letter, is that you continue to provide with the product a small plastic cap attached to the cartridge, which could be placed over the opened cartridge tip to prevent eye contact.

If these conditions are not complied with, the registration will be subject to cancellation in accordance with FIFRA section 6(e). Your release for shipment of the product bearing the amended labeling constitutes acceptance of these conditions.

DIRECTION: FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling. Read this entire label before beginning and follow all use directions and precautions.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage and disposal.
STORAGE: Store in the original container away from food or feed, in a cool dry place, inaccessible to children and pets. If opened, secure plastic cap on tip of cartridge.
PESTICIDE DISPOSAL: Wastes resulting from the use of this product may be disposed of on site or at an approved waste disposal facility.
CONTAINER DISPOSAL: If empty, do not reuse this container. Place in trash or offer for recycling if available.
IF PARTLY FILLED: Call your local solid waste agency for disposal instructions. Never place unused product down any indoor or outdoor drain.

USE RESTRICTIONS: This product may be used to repel pigeons, starlings and house (English) sparrows from buildings and adjacent structures. This product may be applied to window sills, roof lines, gutter edges, signs, ornamental copings, cornices, ledges, and similar surfaces. Wear disposable gloves when using this product. Do not apply this product in rainy or damp weather or in temperatures below freezing. Product should be approximately at room temperature (65 - 80°F) (18-27°C) at the time of application.

PREPARING SURFACES FOR TREATMENT:
 1. To reduce potential exposure to bird-related diseases, wear waterproof gloves and a respirator approved by the U.S. Bureau of Mines for dust protection when cleaning areas to be treated. Prepare surfaces to be treated by removing dirt, droppings and other debris. Using water mixed with a wetting agent or detergent, wet surfaces where droppings are present to limit generation of airborne dust during cleaning. Allow cleaned surfaces to dry fully prior to treatment as product adhesion may be poor on wet surfaces.
 2. Check the condition of the surface to which the repellent is to be applied. Treat porous surfaces such as wood, stone, or concrete with an undercoating such as paint or sealer before applying TANGLEFOOT BIRD REPELLENT. On asphalt or wood shingles, or on any other surface from which relatively easy removal of product is desired, apply waterproof tape or similar material first and apply the repellent to the tape rather than its substrate.

APPLICATION DIRECTIONS:
 1. Place cartridge in standard caulking gun.
 2. Angle-but the tip of the cartridge to desired bead width: 1/4" (6mm) for starlings and pigeons; 3/8" (3mm) for house sparrows. DO NOT APPLY BEADS WIDER THAN THOSE INDICATED.
 3. Beginning 1" (2.5 cm) from outside edge, apply product in a line traveling the length of the surface to be treated. Leave 1" gaps in bead every 10" (25cm) to allow for drainage. One such bead should be sufficient on surfaces up to 4" (10 cm) wide. For surfaces 4" - 8" (10-20cm) wide, apply two parallel beads spaced 2" (5 cm) apart, with the outermost bead being 1" from the outer edge. On surfaces wider than 8" (20 cm) apply a series of parallel beads 2" - 3" (5-7 cm) apart or apply two parallel beads 1" from the outer edges and a repeating "S-shaped" line throughout the area between the outer beads.
 4. One ounce of product will cover one linear foot at the bead width indicated for starlings and pigeons. Less product will be needed per linear foot at the bead width indicated for house sparrows.
 5. The effectiveness of this product will diminish if it becomes largely covered with dirt and debris. In such cases, clean the surface and repeat treatment.
 6. Keep plastic cap on opened cartridge to prevent product contacting eyes.
CLEAN-UP: Remove product from person and application equipment by using vegetable oil first, followed by soap and water. Clean treated surfaces by removing tape (if used) and by scraping off material and applying mineral spirits. Wear appropriate skin and respiratory protection when performing these tasks.
