Dear Mr. Broshdahl,

The following amendment submitted in connection with registration under FIFRA, as amended, is acceptable with the conditions listed below.

- Update first aid statements per PR Notice 2001-1.

Conditions

Revise the label as follows:

1. The "Precautionary Statement" must be updated to reflect the following acute toxicity profile for the Alkyl (C₁₂ 40%, C₁₄ 50%, C₁₆ 10%) dimethyl ammonium chloride.

Corrosive. Causes irreversible eye damage and skin burns. Do not get in eyes, on skin, or on clothing. Wear goggles or face shield, protective clothing, and rubber gloves. *May be fatal if swallowed, absorbed through the skin, or inhaled. Do not breathe vapor. Wear a dust mist filtering respirator (MSHA/NIOSH approval # prefix TC-21C).* Wash thoroughly with soap and water after handling and before eating, drinking, or using tobacco. Remove contaminated clothing and wash before reuse.

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2. Under TEX STAT, revise the second paragraph by specifying “*odor causing*” organisms.
 3. Under TEX STAT, revise the third paragraph by deleting the term, “many,” and stating replacing it with “*odor causing*.”
 4. Place the phrase, “For Industrial Use Only,” on the front panel of the label.

Residual Bacteriostatic and Residual Self-Sanitizing Activity under conditions of high relative humidity or wet contamination.

Fabric treated with TEX STAT as directed below will develop residual bacteriostatic and residual self-sanitizing activity against Gram Positive (*Staphylococcus aureus*) and Gram Negative (*Klebsiella pneumoniae*) organisms.

Fabric treated with TEX STAT which has become contaminated or soiled through use will inhibit the growth of many organisms not only at the time of exposure, but also through the handling and transportation procedures until the garments are again laundered and treated with TEX STAT.

It is particularly effective in inhibiting the growth of ammonia producing organisms such as *Brevibacterium ammoniagenes*, which acts on urine in the diapers to produce ammonia.

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DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

TEX STAT is recommended for use in the final rinse cycle of the laundry operation. Introduce TEX STAT into the wash wheel at the rate of 1 1/8 ounce of TEX STAT per 100 pounds of dry laundry. It is recommended that TEX STAT be added halfway through the final rinse cycle filling operation.

FOR INDUSTRIAL USE ONLY**STORAGE AND DISPOSAL****DO NOT CONTAMINATE WATER, FOOD OR FEED BY STORAGE OR DISPOSAL.**

Pesticide Storage: Store in a dry place no lower in temperature than 50°F or higher than 120°F.

Pesticide Disposal: Pesticide wastes are acutely hazardous. Improper disposal of excess pesticide, spray mixture, or rinsate is a violation of Federal Law.
